#### **Board Comments**

Supervisor Potter read a letter from Cal Fire thanking the hospitality leaders regarding lodging accommodations for the firefighters that were here for the Soberanes Fire. He noted that there were 39 hotels that provided accommodations for fire fighters during a tourism busy time; every community in the County participated in providing lodging.

Supervisor Armenta advised that the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) Board of Directors are meeting this Thursday, September 1, 2016 in Sacramento. He is undecided as to whether he will attend in person or participate via conference call. He noted that he received a call from the Executive Director, Matt Cate, advising that the Governor will appear before the Board of Directors Thursday, to ask the Board to take an affirmative position on Proposition 57, the Governor's initiative. He explained that Proposition 57 rewards those with non-violent offenses to be eligible for parole, once they meet the minimum part of their sentence. He advised that District Attorney's in California oppose the proposition, probation supports the proposition and the Statewide Sheriff's Association is neutral. Supervisor Armenta advised that he will be asked to take a neutral position.

Supervisor Phillips announced that positive things are happening in District 2. Recently, there was a Wellness Day with bordering counties, San Benito and Santa Cruz, celebrating community. Supervisor Phillips advised that he did not attend the Wellness Day because he attended the 6th Annual Family Fun Day at Rancho Cielo. There were volunteers from local high schools, Harntell College football team, two superior court judges, two district attorneys and two private attorneys. Festivities included tractor rides, a dancing horse, music program, dance program and 75 children caught their first fish. He estimated that there were 1200-1300 people in attendance and 750 meals served, all with volunteers coming togehter and showing what a great community we have.

Supervisor Salinas offered his heartfelt thanks to Mission San Antonio and the Lockwood Community Center, as they became the informal shelters for the mandatory evacuees of the Chimney Fire. He noted that there were no

structures or lives lost in this fire.

Supervisor Parker advised that Marina's Labor Day parade is this Saturday, September 3, 2016 for kids and adults. The parade has horses, dogs, classic cars, dancing and marching bands. Following the parade, there will be a festival at the Vince Dimaggio park.

Supervisor Armenta noted that his three year old grandson came to visit and they visited Tatum's Park. He noted that it's a great park.
