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RE: Strategic Grant Services Program: Grants Update

Background:

The Strategic Grants Services Program (SGSP) focuses on identifying funding for the County's priority funding needs. The program is managed by the County Administrative Office, Intergovernmental and Legislative Affairs Division in partnership with Nossaman LLP. Priorities are defined by the Board's Strategic Initiatives, the Board's Legislative Priorities, availability of grant funding, ability to meet grant requirements, and a strategic analysis of the County's ability to submit a competitive grant application. Since Nossaman began working with the County, the SGSP has helped secure over \$12 million in grant funding for various Departments.

The matrix attached serves as an update on the activities of the SGSP, and provides information on grants awarded in 2017, grant applications recently submitted, and grant applications currently in progress. The SGSP has alerted County departments and nonprofit partners of ten grant programs on topics such as homelessness, children's services, services for victims of crimes, and redevelopment since January 1, 2017.

SGSP Highlights:

California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES): The County has submitted a letter to CalOES to formally request reconsideration of the denial of California Disaster Assistance Act (CDAA) funding for the Soberanes Fire. The letter also requests a meeting with CalOES to discuss the reconsideration and the future request for the winter storms damage, which was declared as a State of Emergency by Governor Brown on January 23, 2017. The letter was carbon copied to the Governor's Office and the legislative delegation representing Monterey County. Additionally, Nossaman has briefed Assemblyman Stone, Assemblywoman Caballero and staff for Senator Monning and Senator Canella on the appeal to CalOES for the Soberanes Fire and the future need for funding from the CDAA for the winter storms.

Drinking Water Solutions for the Community of San Lucas: In late January, County staff met with representatives from the State Water Resources Control Board to discuss drinking water solutions for the community of San Lucas. Following the call, the State Board sent the County a formal request to prepare a scope of work to further evaluate the treatment alternative for the San Lucas Water District. Once the scope of work, timeline, and budget for evaluating the treatment alternative is finalized, the State has committed to amending the financing agreement to incorporate the necessary work.

Veterans Court Expansion: The SGSP will be working with the Probation Department and the Courts on an application through the U.S. Department of Justice Adult Drug Court Discretionary Grant Program. Nossaman will be taking a lead role on the application, assisting with writing and packaging all necessary supporting documentation to compile a competitive grant program. The County will be requesting funding for a new full time Probation Officer position with a sole focus on the Veterans Court and expanding the amount of cases the Court is able to hear. Applications are due Tuesday, February 28th.

Cap and Trade Funding: The Legislature has increased funding in the last legislative session for the Cap and Trade program which provides \$900 million for programs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions. Programs from the Cap and Trade funding allocation which closely align with County's priority needs include the Active Transportation Program, the Transformative Climate Communities, and the Urban Greening Program. The SGSP will actively engage with the various state agencies as they implement these grant programs to ensure the County is eligible and able to submit a competitive grant application.

In addition to the grant programs we are actively working on below, we have alerted County Departments and nonprofit partners of ten other funding opportunities since January 1, 2017.
