Zoning Codes do not contemplate every permissible or prohibited use of property. Therefore, Planning staff interpret the Zoning Codes when a use is sought. Disputes over allowable uses arise between landowners/applicants, neighbors, and Planning staff. To resolve these disputes, Monterey County Code Chapter 21.82 allows anyone to request a Decision or Opinion from the Director of Planning (commonly referred to as a "Director's Interpretation"). The Director must respond within 10 days. These decisions or opinions may be appealed within 10 days to the Planning Commission and then to the Board of Supervisors. No notice to neighbors or interested parties is currently required. This referral is to direct RMA to return to the Board with an amendment of the County Code to provide for prompt notice of requests for a Director's Decision/Opinion and issuance of the Decision/Opinion to property and persons requesting notice regarding such property or application. If the 10-day time periods are too short to provide notice, RMA is directed to amend the Code to extend those periods to 20 days.
