Reasons for Wanting to Serve

I have served as an Alternate Director on the interim SVBGSA since its creation. I filled in for Director Lou Calcagno in two meetings during that time. Prior to that I attended many of the Collaborative Work Group and Stakeholder meetings before the agency was formed. I am familiar with the issues before this agency.

There are many diverse needs for water in the Salinas Valley basin: commercial, agricultural, residential and environmental are some of those. The permanent Board needs to mirror those interests, and it appears that it will to a great degree. However, nearly 40,000 people in the county are served by mutual water companies of 16-199 connections. This is approximately $1/10^{th}$ of the county's population, and, presumably, $1/10^{th}$ of the population in the Salinas Valley basin. Like the smaller systems of 2-15 connections, these companies are served by the Health Department and not directly by the state. These mutual water companies face stress from the drought, increasing regulations and water quality issues. They need representation on this Board. The SVBGSA's Advisory Board has about two dozen members but no one has been specifically selected to represent the smaller mutual water companies. No one on the interim Board represents that viewpoint but myself. It is important for tens of thousands of people to have someone with an understanding of their water concerns be able to speak for them just as agriculture, cities, water companies and the environment have representatives.

I manage a mutual water company of 31 residential connections, operate a farm and businesses. My experience has allowed me to see that there is no single path to solving our water problems. It is going to require compromise and patience. There is a need for new approaches while respecting diverging opinions. Neither farmers, businesses, homeowners nor any other water interest must bear the brunt of whatever solutions are proposed. The burden must be shared as equally as possible. Board members need to be able to express the concerns of the constituency they represent, but they must have an open mind to develop a solution for the entire Salinas Valley basin. I am committed to that.
