**RE:** Strategic Grant Services Program: Grants Update

## **Background:**

The Strategic Grants Services Program (SGSP) focuses on identifying funding for the County's priority funding needs. The program is managed by the County Administrative Office, Intergovernmental and Legislative Affairs Division in partnership with Nossaman LLP. Priorities are defined by the Board's Strategic Initiatives, the Board's Legislative Priorities, availability of grant funding, ability to meet grant requirements, and a strategic analysis of the County's ability to submit a competitive grant application. Since Nossaman began working with the County, the SGSP has helped secure over \$13 million in grant funding for various Departments.

The matrix attached provides an update on the activities of the SGSP, and provides information on grants awarded in 2017, grant applications recently submitted, and grant applications currently in progress. The SGSP has alerted County departments and nonprofit partners of 20 grant programs on topics such as fire restoration, homelessness, children's services, services for victims of crimes, and redevelopment since January 1, 2017.

## SGSP Grants and Legislative/Regulatory Advocacy Effort Highlights:

- i. Interlake Tunnel White Bass Issue: Water Resources Agency (WRA) is reviewing the most recent draft MOU from the Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW). CDFW has indicated that fish screens will be necessary for the project to move forward and grant funding will only be eligible for the project, if the scope is expanded to include other improvements within the watershed. Supervisor Alejo has reached out to Senator Monning and Senator Monning's office is looking to coordinate a meeting with the County and CDFW.
- ii. Grant Award Monterey County Veterans Treatment Court Enhancement: The Probation Department was awarded \$400,000 through the U.S. Department of Justice Adult Drug Court Grant Program for a new full time Probation Officer position with a sole focus on the Veterans Court and expanding the amount of cases the Court is able to hear. Funding will also go toward strengthening the partnership and services offered with the Veterans Resource Center.
- iii. Cal OES Hazard Mitigation Assistance Grant: The Resource Management Agency (RMA) submitted a Notice of Intent (NOI) to apply for the Cal OES/FEMA Flood Mitigation Assistance Program and the Hazard Mitigation Program for the CRFREE project. Cal OES notified the County not to proceed with a full application. We have been working with Cal OES to better understand why we have not been invited for a full application, but we know it likely has to do with the funding gap and timing of the project. We are working on setting up a meeting with Cal OES in the next couple of weeks to discuss next steps.

The Carmel Area Wastewater District is submitting an application to the Hazard Mitigation Program that will address the environmental issues downstream. The County is providing a support letter for this project.

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iv. SB 1 Sustainable Communities and Climate Adaptation Planning Grants: Caltrans announced the first solicitation of SB 1 planning money through the Sustainable Communities Program and the Client Adaptation Program. The County was alerted of the funding opportunities but no projects have been identified. We will continue to work with the County on potential projects, as there will be on-going funding each year provided through these grant programs.
