# GENERAL UPDATES

- The grant has been reviewed and approved by the County Board of Supervisors
- The contract with Sun Street Centers has been approved by the County Board of Supervisors
- The contracts for MILPA, Turning Point, CRLA, and CSUMB will be presented to the Board in January
- The first quarter evaluation and the Evaluation Plan were submitted to the BSCC in November

# UPDATES ON IMPLEMENTATION

## Public Defender's Office

- Has continued to submit reclassification paperwork.
- They are in the process of hiring an attorney to specialize in the reclassification process.

## MILPA

- They have continued to work with the Public Defender's Office to connect individuals that are eligible for reclassification with that office
- They have hosted two community events, one in Seaside and one in Soledad, to increase awareness of Proposition 47



# UPDATES ON IMPLEMENTATION

## Turning Point

- Is in the process of hiring one individual who will work full time in South County, first in the Behavioral Health Partner offices and later in the Community Center at Sun Street in King City

## CRLA

- They have identified one attorney and one support staff that will specialize in South County and work first in the Partner offices and later in the Community Center.



# UPDATES ON IMPLEMENTATION

## Sun Street Centers

- The Sobering Center in Salinas opened in December 2017
- In October 2017, Sun Street was awarded a CCAH grant that is being used to fund the capital to purchase the property in King City that will become the residential and outpatient substance use disorder treatment center, along with a community center.
- Sun street took possession of the property in King City on January 2, 2018
