WHEREAS, our community can provide opportunities to enrich the lives of individuals of all ages by supporting and engaging older Americans, recognizing their voices and acknowledging their unique contributions and experiences, regardless of income, language, sexual orientation, gender, race or disability, and indeed, we need to assure that these older adults--the fastest growing segment of our population--have the resources they need to function in their communities.
