
Path to Permanent Shelter City of Salinas and Monterey County

Executive Summary



On September 26, 2017 the Monterey
County Board of Supervisors identified
 1220 Natividad Road as the location
for the development of the Permanent
Shelter

 On November 2017, City and County executed a MOU for temporary warming shelter located at 111 W. Alisal St.

Background



- The 2017 Homeless Census & Survey showed an increase of 23%, (estimated 2,837) in the homeless population (sheltered and unsheltered) in Monterey County
- The City of Salinas' homeless population is now estimated at 1,361, an increase of 57% since 2015
- Currently, the City and the County agree that there are insufficient existing shelter and permanent supportive housing resources in Monterey County
- The City and County are working together to address the need
- The City and County currently contract together to operate the Temporary Warming Shelter at 111 W. Alisal Street


Discussion



Permanent Shelter Goals

- 100-150 Nightly Guests
- Year Round Meals and Nightly Shelter
- Supportive Services including Housing and Social Service Navigation, Health Services and Counseling
- Pathway to Permanent Housing
- Architecturally designed to complement the neighborhood

 40-70 Units of Permanent Supportive Housing Possible 1220 Natividad Road (1.71 est. acres)



Next Steps



- City and County collaborate on a shared development agreement
- Request for Proposal (RFP) for a developer and service provider to operate shelter and permanent, supportive housing
- The RFP would include the demolition of the existing building, development of the site, shelter operations
- City would assist in developing a funding mechanism for the shelter with permanent supportive housing project (est. \$30-70 million) and manage the development as the City has the experience and capacity to complete similar housing development projects
- Projected development timeline (est. 2-3 years)

Estimated Project Cost & Funding

Homeless Shelter: \$ 5-10 Million

Supportive Housing: \$ 35-60 Million

Total Estimated Cost: \$ 40-70 Million

Funding mechanism to be determined at a latter date as this project is in draft form.

Public Outreach



 Chosen developer will continue with public outreach during the planning and development of the project
