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## Background

To develop it's first Strategic Plan, Monterey County Health Department (MCHD) reviewed county health data and sought community input on the most pressing health issues across the county and potential solutions to those issues. This work resulted in the identification and adoption of three strategic initiatives in December 2011 as part of the Board of Supervisors' approved MCHD's Strategic Plan for 2011-2016:

- Empower the community to improve health through programs, policies, and activities
- Enhance community health and safety by emphasizing prevention
- Ensure access to culturally and linguistically appropriate, customer friendly services.

MCHD used a *Health in All Policies* and systems integration approach with a focus on prevention to facilitate implementation of the three strategic initiatives across the department and in our community.

## **Making and Measuring our Progress**

This report summarizes indicator impacts and accomplishments for our three initiatives since FY2012, with highlights from FY2017. There was continued work across the three initiative areas both within many MCHD and with our involvement in city-specific and county-wide initiatives through FY2017: we had almost **250 accomplishments in support of the three initiatives, spread across the entire county and within county regions and, with efforts of many initiatives and collaboratives, and 19 indicators saw improvement from baseline.** 

**Accomplishments** included community empowerment training; reaching thousands of school children with Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports, bullying prevention, and youth empowerment programs; promoting prevention-related policies; and increasing access to health care services for thousands of county residents through infrastructure developments and access expansions. Our efforts were recognized when we received the 2017 Arnold X. Perkins Award for Outstanding Health Equity Practice by a California Health Department.

MCHD aligned **81%** of its **performance measures** with one or more of the three strategic initiatives and **over 50% of measures** were meeting targets by FY2017. Alignment of **Board Reports** with initiatives was tracked from July 2013. The majority of Health Department Board Reports each year aligned with one or more of the three strategic initiatives.



## Accomplishments by Fiscal Year and County Region


**Accomplishments** were tracked using an Action Planning matrix. To be counted, an accomplishment had to be a new policy or ordinance, a new grant received, an important community event, or a significant new program, partnership, structural or staffing change that supported one or more of the initiatives.

The Strategic Plan was approved in December 2011. Through June 2017, a total of **246 accomplishments** supporting the three initiatives were recorded. Accomplishments occurred across the three initiatives for the six fiscal years: **109 ( 46%)** related to empowering the community, **62 (26%)** related to enhancing health and safety through prevention, and **67 (28%)** related to ensuring access to culturally and linguistically, customer friendly services.

The Strategic Plan's initiatives' cumulative program accomplishments had broad application, with **70%** applying to the entire county.

Some accomplishments were regional in nature with **35%** in Salinas, **7%** in Peninsula/Big Sur, **6%** in South County, and **2%** in North County.

## **Examples of Accomplishments FY2016-17**

**Empower the Community:** 69 community members completed the 8-week enLACE (Leadership and Civic Engagement) training and most attended their first civic meeting as part of the training. Cohorts were held in Salinas, Castroville, Gonzales, Greenfield, and King City. The King City cohort included an adult and a youth group. Cohorts learned how to apply for community grants as part of their cohort project.

**Empower the Community:** Public Health Bureau participated in the Girls' Health in Girls' Hand collaborative, reaching thousands of county girls with reproductive health educational training and supporting girls in creating more awareness for their girls' social and emotional health resolution.

#### **Enhance Health and Safety:**

Through a CDC STRYVE prevention grant, Public Health Bureau staff implemented with partners two different school and communitybased violence prevention strategies in 10 elementary schools and 3 youth centers in Salinas. **Empower the Community:** Staff provided support and guidance to several initiatives through engaging the community around action planning and activity alignment. Staff in turn received training in Governing for Racial Equity.

**Ensure Access to Health Services:** Clinic Services and Behavioral Health developed several improvements to their clinics this year, including tenant improvements, clinic expansions, integrated services planning, and building new clinics that accommodate integrated services. Of note, a partnership with the Community Hospital of the Monterey Peninsula supported the groundbreaking for a new, expanded clinic in Seaside at our original clinic location. The new clinic will have expanded services.

**Enhance Health and Safety:** Environmental Health Bureau staff provided trainings and events on food safety knowledge and practice, offered in in English, Spanish and online to support the needs of area food handlers.

**Enhance Health and Safety:** Behavioral Health partnered with Monterey County Office of Education to provide evidence-based Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) in all 25 school districts in the county. This programs reduces bullying and improves students' social/emotional development.

**All Three Initiatives:** MCHD received The California Endowment's 2017 Arnold X. Perkins Award for Outstanding Health Equity Practice by a California Health Department for its work using a Health in All Policies framework with a Collective Impact approach to intentionally expand upstream work on social determinants of health.



**Ensure Access** to Health Services: MCHD and partners provided Medi-Cal outreach assistance to 3,877 people and supported enrollment efforts for the county's pilot program (Esperanza Care) for the remaining uninsured.




## **Performance Measures Aligned with Strategic Initiatives**

MCHD began developing annual **performance measures** for each Bureau in 2011 as part of Managing for Results, the Countywide Performance Measurement Program. These measures are used to monitor progress towards Bureau-specific goals over the course of the fiscal year.

In FY 2012-13, MCHD identified alignments between its performance measures and the three strategic initiatives and has continued this process through the current fiscal year.

While **55%** of performance measures were aligned with at least one initiative in FY2012-13, by FY16-17 it was **81%**. Similar improvements occurred for meeting targets, with **27%** of performance measures meeting their established goals in FY2012-13 while in subsequent years **50% or more** of measure targets were met and most saw improvements within each year.




## **Board Reports Aligned with Strategic Initiatives**

Starting in July 2013, MCHD began recording alignments of its submitted Board Reports with the three strategic initiatives.

From July 2013 through June 2017, **68 to 80% of** Board Reports were aligned with at least one of the three strategic initiatives. Those that were not were generally in support of personnel or budgeting changes for the Department.

About **half** of the Board Reports over the four fiscal years supported initiative 3, while **1 in 4** supported initiative 1 and **1 in 5** supported initiative 2.



## Long Term Indicators Aligned with Strategic Initiatives

MCHD met with community partners in 2014 to assess the strength of the local public health system and the forces of change acting on that system. The results were incorporated into a **Community Health Improvement Plan** (CHIP) linking MCHD strategic initiatives with many county-wide or topic-specific initiatives underway and listing potential and ongoing strategies. Indicator data for the various collaborative efforts are shown below. This matrix and the CHIP are now incorporated into a framework of indicators and strategies that are being used to track the collective impact of numerous initiatives and collaboratives across the county and maintained by the Impact Monterey County Network (www.impactmontereycounty.org).
