WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 87306, the Housing Authority of Monterey County has amended its Conflict of Interest Code as necessitated by changed circumstances;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 82011 and 87303 of the Government Code, the Housing Authority of Monterey County has submitted its amended Code to the Monterey County Board of Supervisors, the code reviewing body, for approval;

WHEREAS, the amended Conflict of Interest Code of the Housing Authority of Monterey County is attached hereto as Attachment A and incorporated herein by reference;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 87303, the Board of Supervisors as code reviewing body may approve the Code as submitted, may revise the proposed Code and approve it as revised, or may return the proposed Code to the agency for revision and resubmission; and

WHEREAS, Monterey County Counsel has recommended that the proposed code be revised as set forth in the attached Memorandum;

WHEREAS, the proposed Code, as amended and as revised as set forth in the attached Memorandum, is lawful under the Political Reform Act of 1974;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Board of Supervisors does hereby revise the proposed code as set forth in the attached Memorandum and approve the Amended Conflict of Interest Code of the Housing Authority of Monterey County as so revised, attached here to as Attachment A, and directs the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to notify the Housing Authority of Monterey County of the revision and approval.

### CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE OF THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY

- (a) The Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code sections 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regs. section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard model Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference, and which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act after public notice and hearings. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regs. section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, along with the attached Appendix in which officials and employees are designated and disclosure categories are set forth are hereby incorporated by reference and constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Housing Authority of the County of Monterey
- (b) Pursuant to Government Code section 81008 and 2 Cal. Code of Regs. section 18730(b)(4), all designated employees shall file statements of economic interest with their agency. Upon receipt of the statement of the Commissioners, the agency shall make and retain a copy and forward the original of the statement to the code reviewing body. Statements for all other designated employees shall be retained by the agency, which shall make the statements available for public inspection and/or reproduction.

#### **EXHIBIT B: DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES**

#### General Provisions

When a member, officer, or employee who holds a designated position is required to disclose investments and sources of income, he or she shall disclose investments in business entities and sources of income which do business in the jurisdiction, plan to do business in the jurisdiction, or have done business in the jurisdiction within the past two years. In addition to other activities, a business entity is doing business within the jurisdiction if it owns real property within the jurisdiction.

When a designated member, officer, or employee who holds a designated position is required to disclose sources of income, he or she shall disclose gifts received from donors located inside as well as outside the jurisdiction.

When a designated member, officer, or employee who holds a designated position is required to disclose interest in real property, he or she shall disclose the type of real property described below, if it is located in whole or in part within, or not more than two miles outside of the boundaries of the jurisdiction, or within two miles of any land owned or used by the Housing Authority of the County of Monterey.

When a designated member, officer, or employee who holds a designated position is required to disclose business position, he or she shall disclose positions in business entities that do business in the jurisdiction, plan to do business in the jurisdiction, or have done business in the jurisdiction within the past two years.

For purposes of this Conflict of Interest Code, the jurisdiction of the Housing Authority of the County of Monterey is the County of Monterey.

#### DISCLOSURE CATEGORY 1:

A member, officer, or employee holding a position assigned to Disclosure Category 1 shall, in the manner described above, report:

All investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income in the jurisdiction.

Interests in real property in the jurisdiction, which were acquired by, leased, or otherwise used by the Housing Authority of the County of Monterey.

His or her status as director, officer, partner, trustee, employee, or holder of a management position in any business entity in the jurisdiction.

SUBJECT: Housing Authority of Monterey County Conflict of Interest Code

Government Code section 87303(b) provides that the Board, as the code reviewing body for local agencies, may revise a proposed Conflict of Interest Code and approve it, as revised. The Housing Authority of Monterey County has submitted an amended Conflict of Interest Code to the Board for review.

County Counsel recommends that the Board revise this Conflict of Interest Code to incorporate the definition of consultants set forth in Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations, section 18700.3(a) into the Conflict of Interest Code.

County Counsel recommends that the Board approve the proposed Conflict of Interest Code for the Housing Authority of Monterey County as so revised.
