Status Update: Illegal Dumping in Monterey county

- Illegal Dumping and Litter Abatement Task Force
 - Formerly Monterey County Ad Hoc Illegal Dumping Task Force
 - Created by County Administrative Officer on May 2, 1996
 - Responsibilities include fact finding, public education, and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors
 - Original members: Environmental Health, Sheriff, District Attorney,
 Public Works, CAO



What's Wrong With Illegal Dumping?



- Harm to Public Health- Hazardous waste, drinking water contamination
- Environmental Interactions- Harm to Animals and Fish
- Quality of Life- Creates Odor, Attracts
 Flies, Attracts More Illegal Dumping
- Clean-Up is very, VERY Expensive



Who/what are we dealing with and Why?

- Illegal dumping/litter due to
 - Lack of knowledge of low cost or no cost recyclable opportunities
 - Individuals/businesses lack funds for disposal cost
 - Lack of affordable housing
 - Some people just don't care
- What are we dealing with?
 - A large percentage of illegal dumped materials <u>are</u>
 <u>recyclable items!</u>
 - Hazardous materials/waste (waste oil, road oils, unknowns etc.)
 - Regulated items (tires, waste oils, pesticides)





What We are Doing-Our Solutions

Illegal Dumping and Litter Abatement Task Force (IDALATF)

Working group of local stakeholders who meet monthly to discuss and work on illegal dumping/litter issues.

Annual routine inspection of all vehicles that transport solid waste on county roads







Medical Waste (Sharps)

Sharps waste means any device having acute rigid corners or edges capable of cutting or piercing, including needles syringes, and blades (sharps). Sharps are often home generated from self medication. A rigid sharps container must be used to store sharps waste until it can be taken to an appropriate facility. FREE disposal is available. What We are Doing- Order Community and Litter Abatement Task Force (IDALATF) is a working group with Community of the Community, as well as whose only focus is to reduce illegal dumping in Monterey

> Initially created by the County Administrative Office in May of 1996, and subsequently approved by the Board of Supervisors, the task force began as an ad hoc committee with a mission to reduce illegal dumping through public education and community clean-ups, enforcement of mandatory garbage requirements, and inter-agency cooperation.

Today, our mission is the same - reduce illegal dumping in Monterey County. The impact of illegal dumping to the community comes at a cost affecting public health and safety, land values, quality of life, environmental contamination, and food safety. We are committed to solving this problem.

The Monterey County Health Department, Environmental Health Bureau is chair of the IDALATF and meetings are held monthly. The public is welcome to attend.



The efforts to mitigate illegal dumpsites and litter is a task that must be addressed through a unified effort of community, and state and local public agencies, by way of education, increased recycling, funding of clean-up activities, and action.

Existing Regulations

■ Monterey County Code, Chapter 10.41.040 (A):

A person shall not throw or deposit, or cause to be thrown or deposited, any refuse upon any premises whatsoever except at a permitted disposal facility.

■ California Penal Code 374.3 (A):

It is unlawful to dump or cause to be dumped waste matter in or upon a public or private highway or road, including any portion of the right-of-way thereof, or in or upon private property into or upon which the public is admitted by easement or license, or upon private property without the consent of the owner, or in or upon a public park or other public property other than property designated or set aside for that purpose by the governing board or body having charge of that property.




Illegal Dumping Ordinance

- Whistle blower incentive program
 - Not an effective intervention strategy
 - Requires coordination between DA, Sheriff and County Counsel
 - No penalty fees
 - Cumbersome
 - Time consuming
- **■** Effective pro-active efforts and solutions
 - Community education
 - Access to resources
 - Collaboration
 - Focus on youth
