

Monterey County Inspection Authority

California Food and Agricultural Code section 42821: "An enforcing officer may enter and inspect..."

Monterey County Code - Chapter 10.16.010 – 10.16.060

Produce Inspection - HEAD LETTUCE & SALAD PRODUCTS

ESTABLISHED in 1976, UPDATED 1985, 1986, 1990, 1993, 1998

<u>10.16.020</u> – Inspection and certificate required.

10.16.030 - Fees - Schedule. (\$0.0225 per carton)

Head Lettuce Inspection Program

Inspections required for:

- Quality
- Maturity
- Standardized Containers
- Container Markings
- NOT FOOD SAFETY INSPECTIONS










Head Lettuce Harvest & Inspection



- Inspection at time of harvest
- Neutral (3rd) Party inspections
- Protect Reputation of Quality
- Ensure Fairness in the Marketplace
- Higher market prices for Monterey County lettuce





Market Changes ~ 42 years

- Industry Standards higher than State Regs.
 - Fewer violations, better product before packing.
- Improved Lettuce Varieties
 - pest resistance
 - improved quality
 - longer shelf-life
- Market driven by Consumers and Buyers, not local Brokers
- Increased popularity of <u>Leaf Lettuce</u>, and a decrease in <u>Head Lettuce</u>

Head LettuceAcres & Inspectors

- 1994 = 38 inspectors
- 2018 = 6 inspectors

- 1994 = 73,347 acres
- 2018 = 38,000 acres



Finances

- \$0.0225 per carton fee
- Refund approximately \$200,000
- Loss of Administrative/Overhead Costs -\$130,000 for FY2019/20
- Will Eliminate 10 vacant and 2 filled Produce Inspector Positions



Program & Industry

- Industry believes program is no longer of value
- Growers Shippers Association requested Head Lettuce inspection repeal
- Monterey County Ag Advisory Committee recommends repeal
- Board of Supervisors action needed



Summary

- County Ordinance outdated and unnecessary
- Less production/inspection/violations
- State standards below industry
- Industry no longer sees value
