




After decline, opioid overdose deaths surge in Monterey County


Fake Percocet/Oxycodone pill – laced with potentially deadly fentanyl






CA Opioid Surveillance Dashboard 2018 - Monterey County Data Currently Available












2019 Suspected Drug Overdoses




