### BACKGROUND

#### • OUTDOOR CULTIVATION IS NOT PERMITTED IN COUNTY

- EARLY AD HOC COMMITTEE DISCUSSIONS
  - EXPERIENCE FROM OTHER COUNTIES
    - ENFORCEMENT
    - ENVIRONMENT
    - SECURITY
  - OUTDOOR TO BE EXPLORED AT A LATER DATE
    - CURRENT REGULATIONS STILL REMAIN UNSETTLED




# State License Types

- Specialty Cottage
  - Up to 2,500 sq. ft. or 25 mature plants
- Specialty
  - 2,501 to 5,000 sq. ft. or 50 mature plants
- Small
  - between 5,001 and 10,000 square feet
- Medium
  - between 10,001 and 1 acre









# Other Jurisdictions

- Many Counties have banned outdoor cultivation and/or are still developing regulations
- Santa Barbara, Santa Cruz, Calaveras Permitted
  - Only registered grows that existed prior to MMRSA
- Mendocino Permitted
  - Three Phases of permitting subject to zoning and resource restrictions.
    - Phase 1 only existing, registered grows
    - Phase 2 Indoor only in industrial zones
    - Phase 3 beginning Jan. 2020 all permit types



## Sonoma County

#### Permit outdoor grows

- Specialty cottage (25 mature plants)
  - In Farmland zone and
  - In Rural Residential zones on lots of 2 acres or more subject to Administrative Permit
- Specialty (50 mature plants)
  - In Farmland Zones on lots of 3 acres or more
- Small (5,001-10,000 sq ft)
  - In Farmland Zones on lots of 5 acres or more
- Medium
  - In Farmland Zones on lots of 10 acres or more subject to Use Permit in each case



## Humboldt County

#### Permit outdoor grows

- Specialty grows on large lots permitted with ministerial zoning clearance
- Medium grows permitted on large lots with discretionary Use Permits
- All grows subject to eligibility criteria and siting criteria
  - Zoning Districts
  - Lot sizes
  - Water source
  - Access Roads
  - Slopes
  - Proximity to sensitive receptors
- Cap on Permits established
- EIR prepared for regulations





# Common Challenges

- Odor
- Environmental damage
- Land Values
- Enforcement
- Over production
- Unforeseen permitting challenges
  - Limits on permits (Registration, Zoning, other)
  - Setbacks and minimum lot sizes
  - Discretionary Permit review








# Public Input

- Big Sur Farmers Association
  - Pilot Program (Big Sur and Carmel Valley)
- South County
  - Pre-existing grows with access to power and water
  - Interim allowance for existing grows while regulations are developed
- Opposition
  - Traffic, Environment, odor, and land values






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- Big Sur, Carmel Valley, South County represent large areas of county
  - Grazing Lands and Conservation Zoning Districts
  - Zoning approach would be challenging
- Limited Access to services
  - Water, Roads, Power, etc
- CEQA
  - Potential EIR High Cost & Time
  - Statutory Exemption to expire in 1 year
- Other priorities and staffing constraints
