
MONTEREY COUNTY OFFICIAL FLAG FINAL SELECTION

FRAME DESIGN: Shield with three sections

- 1. BORDER Top Left- Cypress tree (4 local tree species represented)
- 2. Top Right Grapes
- 3. CENTER of SHIELD California Redwood tree
- 4. 1849 Date of California's First Constitutional Convention
- 5. Colton Hall 'Old Monterey'

TOP LEFT


- 6. Cannery Row, Aquarium flues,
