- Joint Powers Authority and 501 (c)(3) nonprofit
- 50 years of experience providing affordable substance abuse, mental health and homeless services
- Board: 15 cities & school districts
- Member of the Homeless Coalition since 1996
- Manages 17 programs in 12 locations throughout the county
- 100 employees; \$7.5M budget



The Gathering for Women







- 501 (c)(3) nonprofit
- Manages day center in Monterey (147 El Dorado Ave.)
- Services include case management, breakfast/lunch meal service, showers, laundry vouchers, clothes closet, job readiness training, enrichment classes
- Since June 2018, has served more than 520 women with more than 18, 000 nutritious meals, 4558 clothes closet visits, and access to 2,550 showers
- Primarily volunteer driven; \$1M budget




- 25 30 person capacity depending on the number and ages of children
- Guests can stay up to 90 days; longer with justification
- Breakfast and dinner provided by GFW
- Comprehensive case management services:
 - Access to health, mental health & substance abuse services
 - Linkages to income, employment, education & housing
 - Services and activities for children
 - Mail and internet access
 - Laundry, clothing & personal items

Project Schedule

• Pre-development: September - February 2020

• Bid Process: March 2020

• Award Contract April 2020

• Rehabilitation: May - October 2020

• Opening: November 2020



Sustainability

- Public-private partnership with State, County, Peninsula cities and private foundations/businesses/donors
- Special Purpose Fund established with CFMC to facilitate philanthropic giving
- Limited capital development and start-up funding provided by HEAP
- HHAP and other State funding possibilities
- Estimated annual operating costs = \$850,000
