Projects Included

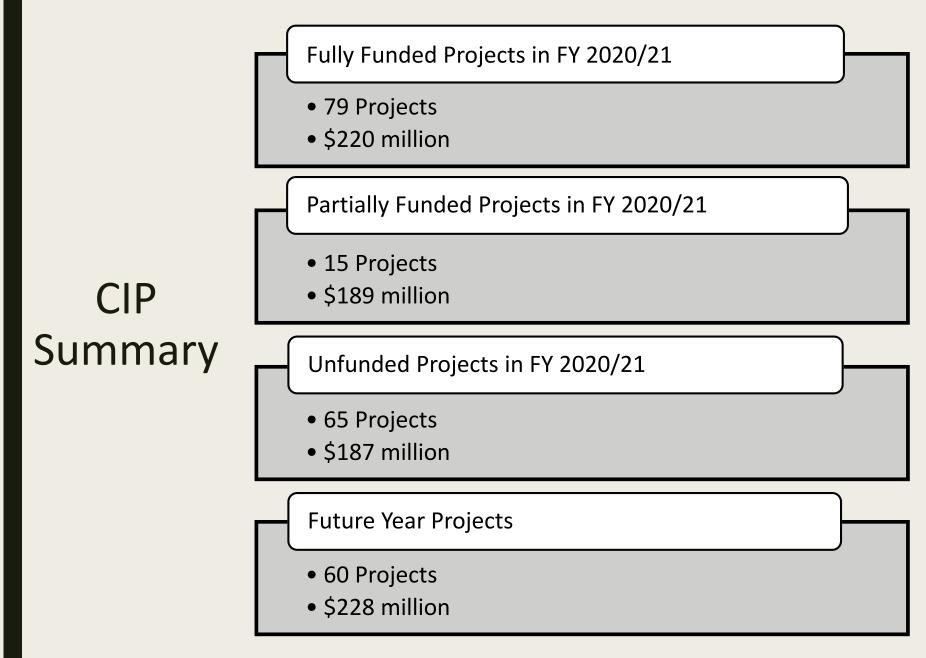
- \$100,000+ value

Major Facility Projects for FY 2020/21

New Juvenile Hall

- 1420 Natividad Road, Salinas
- Phase II re-scope approved by BOS on June 9th
- \$ 5.4 million for FY 2020/21
- \$61.3 million total project cost

Emergency Homeless Shelter

- 855 E. Laurel Drive, Salinas
- \$2.9 million for FY 2020/21
- \$7.2 million total project cost

Behavioral Health

- East Salinas Center
- Complete design and issue bid in FY 2020/21
- \$26.1 million total project cost

CIP Review to Date

- Capital Improvement Committee
 - April 13th: FY 2020/21 Draft CIP
 - May 11th: Unfunded project priorities
- Budget Committee
 - April 29th: FY 2020/21 Draft CIP
 - May 27th: Unfunded project priorities
- Planning Commission
 - May 13th: General Plan Conformance

2. Approve the Probation Elevator Repair and Health Water Intrusion projects.

- Probation Elevator Replacement: \$350,000
 - Elevator is obsolete and requires complete overhaul
 - Necessary for ADA access to second floor
- Health Water Intrusion: \$221,000
 - Repair water damage caused by heavy rains
 - Repairs will prevent further water intrusion
- Both projects are recommended for funding by Budget Committee

3. County Road Maintenance Program

- Board requested staff explore ways to address road maintenance in smaller communities
- Three (3) programs address countywide roadway maintenance:
 - 1. Pavement Asset Management Plan (Large Roadway Projects)
 - 2. Community Street Repair Program (Measure X Obligations)
 - 3. New: County Road Maintenance Program
- New: County Road Maintenance Program

County Road Maintenance Program

- Address smaller roadway maintenance needs not captured in large capital projects.
- Approximately 25% of TOT allocation each year.
- Unused funds roll over each fiscal year.
- Pilot program reflects approximate road miles proportion per Supervisorial District:
 - 10% Divided between Districts 1 and 4
 - 25% District 2
 - 40% District 3
 - 25% District 5

4. Litter Abatement Program

- Removes illegal dump sites around the County
- Supplement existing RMA litter abatement efforts
- The Litter Abatement Program forms a partnership among the County, waste districts and contractor(s).
 - Salinas Valley Solid Waste Authority
 - Monterey Regional Waste Management District
 - Health Department Environmental Health Bureau
 - *Resource Management Agency*
- Staff proposes allocating \$100,000 of Road Fund TOT funding each year
- Unused funds roll over each fiscal year

Recommendation

- 1. Adopt a resolution approving the County of Monterey Capital Improvement Program Five-Year Plan for Fiscal Years 2020/21 through 2024/25.
- 2. Approve use of Building Replacement and Improvement Fund to fund Probation Elevator Repair and Health Water Intrusion projects.

- 4. Approve the Litter Abatement Program Standard Operating Procedure.
