WHEREAS, the County of Monterey Capital Improvement Program Five-Year Plan for Fiscal Years (FYs) 2020/21 through 2024/25 (hereinafter CIP) sets forth public projects essential to maintain and improve County public facilities and facilitate the orderly implementation of the County General Plan;

WHEREAS, the County of Monterey Resource Management Agency (RMA) works with County Departments to update the CIP on a yearly basis to reflect County needs, priorities, and available funding;

WHEREAS, the Capital Improvement Committee (CIC) and Budget Committee (BC) supported the approval of the CIP on April 13, and April 29, 2020;

WHEREAS, on May 11, and May 28, 2020, the CIC recommended the following six (6) unfunded projects as priority unfunded projects for available capital funds:

- 1. Project #8875 RMA-PW&F <u>855 E. Laurel Drive</u>, <u>Salinas Emergency Homeless Shelter-New Building</u> (DSS);
- 2. Project #2001 Health 1270 Natividad Road, Salinas Water Intrusion Project;
- 3. Project #61108 Library North County Bookmobile;
- 4. Project #1930 IT-20-01 <u>ITD Countywide E911;</u>
- 5. Project #3600 RMA-PW&F Davis Road Bridge Replacement and Road Widening;
- 6. Project #PD 2017-01 Probation 1422 Natividad Road Elevator Modernization;

WHEREAS, on May 28, 2020, the BC supported staff's funding recommendations for the six (6) priority unfunded projects above; and

WHEREAS, on May 13, 2020, the Planning Commission (PC) adopted a resolution determining that the CIP conforms to and is consistent with the 2010 Monterey County General Plan, the Local Coastal Program, and 1982 General Plan as applicable, and recommended future Capital Improvement Program development prioritize projects that address deficient Level of Service (LOS) roadways identified in 2010 General Plan.

## **Executive Summary**

## Description of the Capital Improvement Program

The Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is a five-year plan that sets forth public projects essential to maintain and improve County public facilities and facilitate the orderly implementation of the County General Plan. Public facilities include buildings, major equipment, telecommunications infrastructure, parks, and transportation systems. CIP projects cost more than \$100,000 and provide long-term assets to Monterey County. Budgeted costs include design, environmental, construction, equipment, land purchase, and project administration of new, improved, or replacement infrastructure. The costs identified in FY 2020/21 are appropriated as a part of the operating and capital budget process.

Each year, the CIP is updated and reviewed considering County needs, priorities, and available funding. A long-term CIP provides several benefits:

- Prioritizes needs and establishes an orderly basis for sound budgetary decisions.
- ♦ Focuses attention on both mandated and community goals, needs, and capabilities for best use of public funds and establishes a long-term plan to address future needs.
- Improves the likelihood of obtaining State and Federal financing assistance for projects.
- ♦ Encourages project coordination between the County and public agencies which serves to reduce scheduling conflicts.
- Permits private enterprise to relate and/or align their projects to the CIP.

### Development of the Capital Improvement Program

The CIP includes capital projects planned as part of the capital budgets managed by the Resource Management Agency (RMA), Natividad, and Information Technology Department (ITD). Capital Projects are funded through capital funds budgeted in Funds 002, 402, and 404 and by individual department budgets. Natividad manages its own funds for capital projects and is included in the CIP for reference only. RMA does not review or rank Natividad's projects. Monterey County Water Resources Agency (MCWRA) is not considered a department of the County, so the CIP does not include MCWRA projects.

RMA presents the draft CIP to the Capital Improvement Committee (CIC) for priority determination and to the Budget Committee (BC) for fiscal matters. After necessary revisions are made, the CIP is presented to the Planning Commission to determine conformity with the General Plan. The final CIP is presented to the Board of Supervisors for consideration as part of the annual budget process. Capital Projects are divided into one of four categories:

- ♦ Attachment A: Fully Funded Projects Fiscal Year 2020/21
- ♦ Attachment B: Partially Funded Projects Fiscal Year 2020/21
- ♦ Attachment C: First Year Unfunded Projects Fiscal Year 2020/21
- ♦ Attachment D: Future Projects

The adopted five-year CIP is a dynamic document updated annually. Projects shown for FYs 2021/22 through 2024/25 are planned projects (**Attachment D**). With each annual update, projects shown in future years may remain unchanged (or constant), be delayed, or eliminated. Projects not included in the current CIP may be included through annual updates.

## FY 2020/21 CIP Update Highlights

RMA worked closely with County departments to identify capital needs, related costs, and funding sources. An overview of projects characterized by their funding status is illustrated in **Table E1** below. **Table E2** provides FY 2019/20 CIP Update overview for comparison.

Summaries and details for FY 2020/21 capital projects are illustrated within each Attachment section categorized by their funding status.

### **Unfunded Project Scoring**

All projects requesting funds in FY 2020/21 are scored using two criteria. A detailed description of each scoring criteria is provided at the end of this summary (Tables E3 and E4). RMA conducted the standard project review and scoring process based on life/health/safety impacts initiated in FY 2017/18. Project scores are provided to the Capital Improvement Committee as a tool in determining the final prioritization of unfunded projects for the CIP. The list of unfunded projects does not affect the budget. Each department's project priority is also considered into scoring. If a department submits multiple unfunded projects for FY 2020/21, an additional point value is assigned to the top priority project. Additionally, these projects have been ranked utilizing a Government Alliance on Race and Equity (GARE) Racial Equity Tool. In FY 2018/19, the CIC encouraged GARE cohorts to meet with department heads and evaluate the benefit of racial-equity-focused projects against the impact of delaying or replacing current identified needs. The CIC places an emphasis on projects benefitting targeted geographical areas, such as disadvantaged communities which may qualify to leverage grant funding. The final criteria and associated GARE scores for unfunded projects are included at the end of this summary. RMA will continue to collaborate with the cohort to develop the scoring process in future CIP updates. The scoring for all partially funded projects (**Attachment B**) and all Fiscal Year 2020/21 unfunded projects (Attachment C) are illustrated in Attachment E.

## CIP and Facility Assessment Planning

A Countywide Facility Assessment Study was conducted in 2015. The consultants who conducted the study visited 81 County Facilities with the goal to document the condition of each, identify current deficiencies and future needs, and prioritize corrective capital expenditures. The final report approved by the Board of Supervisors in March 2016 prioritized all recommended improvements into immediate, critical, impending, necessary, and discretionary project need categories with a proposed implementation duration spanning from one to five years. The increased cost of construction during future priority periods was anticipated as well as administrative soft costs for the County to conduct the projects. Deficiencies **not** included in this cost were ADA compliance, building-code-related upgrades, structural/seismic improvements, site work (utilities/site features), or environmental remediation services. The total project cost to implement all the repairs and replacements identified in the Report for County and Natividad Medical Center facilities over the five-year span was \$135M.

## **Funding Sources**

Capital Projects are funded through capital funds budgeted in Funds 002, 402, and 404 and by individual department budgets. Funding may come from multiple sources including local, state, and federal grants, Gas Tax, SB 1, Measure X, impact fees, and capital funds

## **Building Use Allowance**

Effective FY 2017-18, the County began allocating depreciation for buildings in lieu of a building use allowance where buildings are depreciated based on their assigned useful life. Depreciation is allocated among the County departments or other agencies based on the square footage occupied. Receipts are held in an internal service fund with the intent to be used for facility maintenance and replacement.

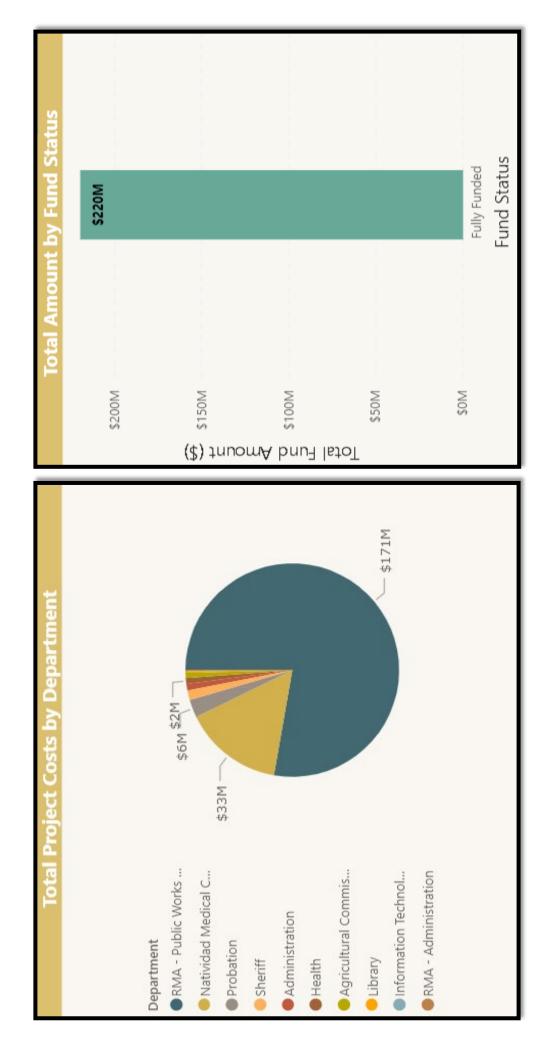

The Agricultural Center Conference Room is used by the AC, the University of California Cooperative Extension (UCCE), other County departments, and community groups. ### Justification

An engineering report and soil analysis concluded that due to dry conditions, the soil beneath the foundation is shrinking and causing structural damage. Monterey County is very spread out and many residents face social and economic challenges, and newer bookmobiles can also serve as technology hubs, and provide greater access for those with physical challenges than the 1993 Thomas Bus can.

Monterey County Free Libraries has successfully applied for a grant and has an Intent to Award notice from the California State Library for \$250,000 of the cost. The Project scope originally called for only hot water to be conditioned to protect the boilers. During the Construction phase, the Contractor discovered that the submitted and approved hot water softener unit would not fit the planned location. County staff approved a change order to modify the original design to a Rayne Water system and include both hot and cold water to match water softener systems that have been replaced in other County facilities. This larger water softener system also required considerably more space than the original unit, requiring an external enclosure to house the equipment to be located outside the main Project structure. This external enclosure design was approved by the County. As a result, the specification for an interior hot water-only system was deleted.

#### Justification

If the water softener system is not installed at this time, the Jail Housing Addition will not have water conditioning for either hot or cold water. Avoidable replacement costs will be incurred as accelerated scaling and corrosion in pipes and plumbing fixtures greatly reduces the plumbing system lifespan. Increased repair and replacement work in an active jail facility also increases security risks. The existing Jail would continue to have conditioned water provided under the existing water softener system.

This project would install a backup system or bypass to the Jail Housing Addition lift station, pending the final architect design recommendations. Prior to the Jail Housing Addition project, there was a bypass sewer line connecting the Jail to the Natividad Medical Center (NMC) sewer system. This connection delayed sewer system backup and gave Facilities staff time to resolve the issue or begin backup pumping. The original construction plans for the Jail Housing Addition capped this connection to NMC, effectively increasing the risk of sewage backup into the Jail if the lift station failed. The increase in inmate population as a result of the Jail Housing Addition will also impact the rate at which the system could potentially overflow.

#### Justification

As recently as November 2019 and January 2020, the existing sewer lift station shut down unexpectedly. Extended delay in returning it to operation would have potentially led to a sewage spill into the facility. The County will continue to carry the liability risk associated with the current system until a backup solution is in place.

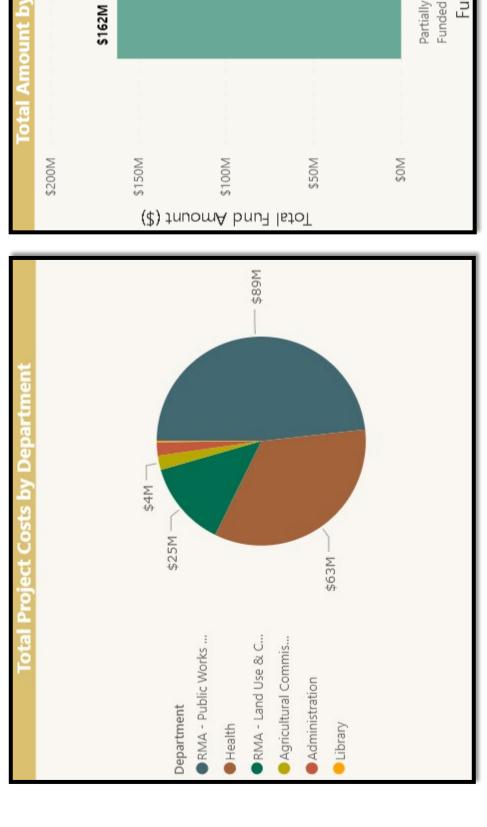

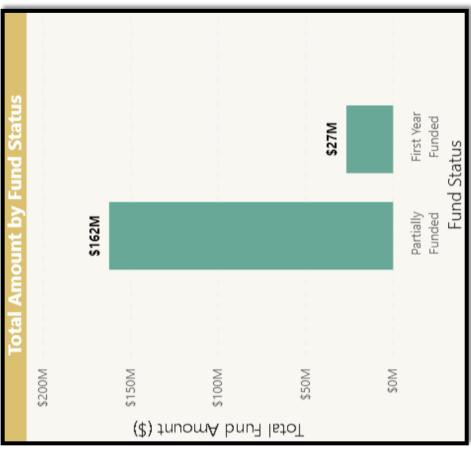


# Section B.2 Partially Funded Projects for FY 2020/21 Overview Chart

In FY 2016/2017, the Bradley Branch Library lost its lease of a small facility that it occupied for several decades. The Library served the community and the rapidly growing local elementary school population in this remote part of the county. In FY 2017-2018, the County Board of Supervisors allocated \$200,000 to investigate the feasibility of acquiring a new site for a replacement library. Recently, the Library began discussions with the local school about the possibility of locating a facility on the school campus. Due to leadership changes at the Library, the original \$200,000 allocation was not spent in FY 2018/2019. As a result recent discussions with local school leadership in Bradley, pending School Board approval, the school is very interested in working with the Library to support the creation of a replacement facility which will serve the residents and students of Bradley. The Library is requesting that the original sum of \$200,000 be reallocated to the Library and that an additional sum of \$100,000 be provided to acquire, design, and build-out a prefabricated structure (approximately 1500 square feet) on or adjacent to the school.

#### Justification

Bradley is a remote community far from all County services. There is a strong need for library services. The library serves the community as well as the local elementary school. Since the library lost its rented facility during FY 2016-17, the bookmobile has been used to provide service once a week to the local school and community as a temporary solution. However, the distance of Bradley from the larger libraries, makes it difficult and highly inefficient to serve this community through bookmobile services. The community and the school have expressed a strong desire to have a new library built in the community. There are no rental locations available that would be suitable for a library, and constructing a facility is the most feasible option at this time.

Project Status and Goals/Tasks to be Completed in the 1st Year of the CIP:

FY 20/21 Goals/Tasks: Continue design and planning. Funding is still in account 402 of Public Works. BOS approval to fund was for FY 17-18 but due to leadership changes in library, project is still in planning stages. With the completion of Parkfield and the hiring of a new Library Director, continuing work with the school district an d finding a site in Bradley will be a priority in 20/21.

#### Justification

The lower reach of the Carmel River Basin was the site of multiple expensive and severe flooding incidents in 1995 and 1998. The funding would be used to build on local state and non-profit expenditures directed to reducing repetitive flood damage loss by significantly mitigating future flood risk. FY20/21 Goals/Tasks: Project is in the Final Design and Right-of-Way phases. The goal is to complete easement purchases and obtain the project's regulatory permits. In spring 2020 staff estimated partial FORA funding of \$1,102,450 may be available prior to the agency dissolution, however subsequent budget developments were more conservative and did not include this funding. If FORA funds do become available, staff will evaluate the possibility of allocating those funds to the project.

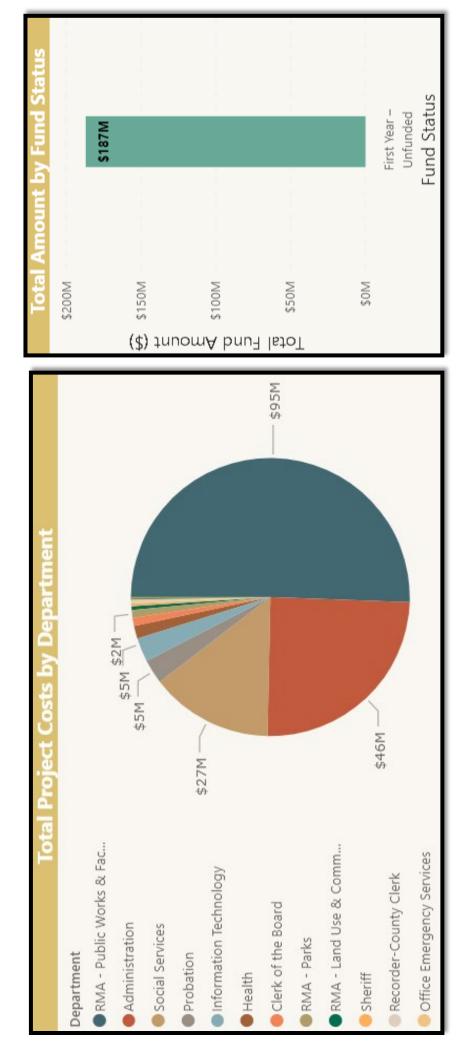

This building is the district office for DSS Community Benefits Branch (CB). Customers visiting this office are able to access services for Snap, EBT cards, CalWORKs and MediCal. This building was built in 1974 for Social Services and the Health department. The Health department moved out of the building to the modulars in the parking are now used for the Peninsula shelter. Currently DSS has 62 employees at this office who need a safe, well-lit parking lot, without potholes and upgrade parking lot lighting to high efficient. This building has been and continues to deteriorate after years of minimal maintenance. The restrooms are outdated and needs replacing to improve customer and employee health and safety. The toilets on the ground floor are unstable and need to be upgraded. The toilets sit low to the ground and booster seats were place on them to make them ADA. This does not represent the image of a caring County to the community we serve. In the second floor employee restrooms, there is visible mold, poor, and inadequate lighting. In the ladies restroom, the vacate space needs remodeling to allow better use. Outside of the men's restroom there is an ill-placed dumbater in the entry. The flooring throughout the building is cracking, lifting and needs to be replaced and it requires the abatement of asbestos. The wallpaper on the stairways is old, discolor and peeling after being re-glued last year by county facilities. The stairways needs additional safety lighting or motion detected lighting as the light switch is a distance from the entrance. Having motion lights would eliminate potential safety issues. DSS installed temporary lighting but an upgrade of the lighting throughout the entire building to energy efficient lighting with motion detection is needed. There is adequate ADA parking spaces but the parking lot needs to resurface and restriped. There are numerous potholes in the parking lot creating potential hazards for customers and staff Without an elevator, disabled employees are unable to collaborate

#### Justification

DSS currently has 62 staff, a program manager, eligibility specialist, supervisors and clerical support at this facility. DSS needs a new building built on the current location. DSS worked with RMA-Real Property staff through the years to identify viable space to meet the department's and community needs. At times, plans were developed with RMA, Health and DSS but nothing fully materialized. The last plans involved the City of Seaside in a property located down the street to include mix use housing. Per the Kitchell report this building needs a new roof, elevator, HVAC upgrade, exterior painting, interior painting, parking lot upgrade, exterior lighting, interior lighting, and electrical upgrades. The HVAC units identified on the Kitchell report have been replaced. Building on current location would allow the County to use the water rights for 1281 Broadway and the modular unit. The scope of the work needed to modernized the building is too costly. The best option for the county and DSS is to build a new building for DSS.

Project Status and Goals/Tasks to be Completed in the 1st Year of the CIP  $\,$ 

FY 20/21 Goals/Tasks: To find a contractor to build a new building at current location while DSS program operations continue in the building. A determination is needed on cost effectiveness to either tear down or gut and rebuild. DSS has no funds to build a building and therefore it's important to be able to have contractor involved willing to lease building back to DSS. Providing an ADA-accessible building, with upgraded lighting, telecommunications, electrical, upgraded parking lot, lobby, conference room, break room, offices and open work areas. Having a new building would help to improve staff morale. The Seaside shelter in modular unit creates an increased usage of the parking lot. The construction will have an impact to the shelter and possible need to be relocate. A new building for DSS Peninsula customers requires access to MST routes with a nearby a bus stop. Preferable a building on Broadway or Fremont provides the convenience of existing bus routes. DSS requires a location with ample parking for staff and customers.

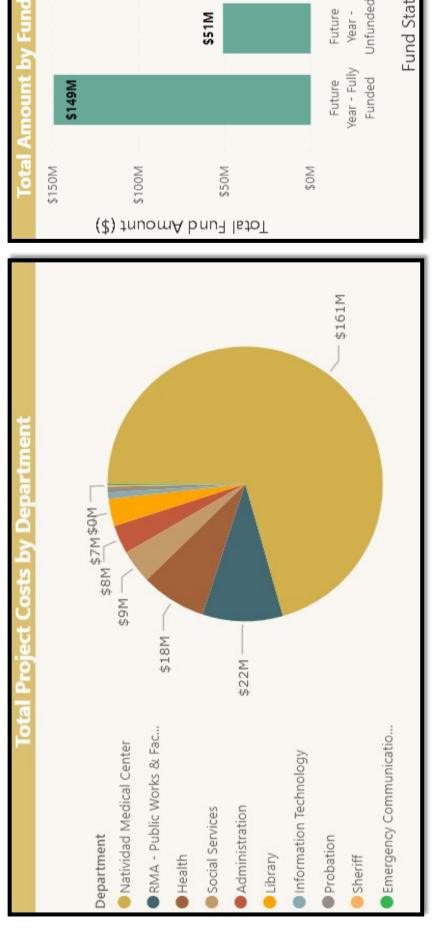

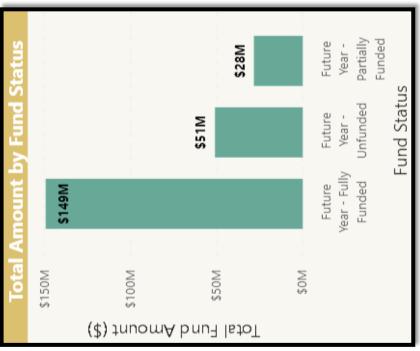

As part of the mission to house and make available County history, Monterey County Free Libraries houses and makes available to the public a significant collection of unique and irreplaceable archival materials which focus on the history of the County. The collection includes rare and unique primary and secondary source material like books, pamphlets, maps, photos, back issues of newspapers, etc. dating back to the late 1880s. After the move of the Department's Administrative Offices in 2007 resulted in downsizing available space, the archives were scattered across the County, now housed in a variety of locations, many unsuitable to the long-term care of the materials, and to effective public access. This project is to find a location to consolidated and properly house the physical materials, both for long term preservation and for effective public access.

#### Justification

The Library Director serves as the County Librarian and Archivist for Monterey County. In 2007, the Administrative Offices of the County Library system moved from an old building in Salinas to a new modern building in Marina, which resulted in a drastic reduction of available office space from approximately 20,000 square feet to approximately 10,000 square feet. This loss of space had a serious impact on the library archives, resulted in the fragmentation of the archives – with the materials being dispersed to various sites stretching all the way from Prunedale to King City and from shared rooms that open the collection to theft, to storage closets with unsuitable shelving. The lack of a permanent home for the archives also makes it very difficult for the County Librarian/Library Director to perform duties as the County Archivist, including a plan for preserving, scanning, and digitizing the existing collection, and accepting donations of new historically important materials

The Data911 Mobile Computers in the Sheriff Office vehicles run on Windows 7 Operating System which reaches end of life in 2020 and are required to be upgraded or replaced with alternative solution to prevent loss of data communications with Monterey County Emergency Communications 911, MCSO Records, CLETS, Courts, RMS, JMS, File Server and other public safety resources such as the department of justice portal applications (CSAR, Calphoto, APS, CAL ID, Coplink, DMV, etc). The Data 911 Computers have three separate components; (1) Mounted Monitor (2) CPU M7 which is located in the trunk and referred to as a brick and (3) pheripherals keyboard & mouse. The CPU (M7) component cannot be upgraded and must be replaced to prevent loss of data communications to the Monterey County Network. There are two options: 1. Replace Data911 CPU's which are hard-mounted in the trunk of the vehicle and can only work while in the vehicle. Data911 does not provide the ability to take photos or record interviews. 2. Alternative Solution would be to replace with a mobility device such as a laptop or tablet, which allows the user to take the mobile device into a crime scene for photos, video, interviews, documentation, etc. (e.g., Tablet or other). This facility provides housing for Monterey County women and children involved in Domestic violence and homeless situations. The shelter kitchen needs new stovetops, new kitchen cabinets for storage as current ones are deteriorating due to aged and usage. In addition 2 commercial refrigerators are needed to allow for cold storage of perishables. Smaller residential refrigerators are currently being used, but are not adequate for the number of families at shelter. During the rainy season, this building has experienced water in client rooms coming through from the cracks in the stucco. The exterior of the building needs the cracks in the stucco repaired, water sealed, and painted to prevent future leaks. Recently rubber matting on the backyard ground was removed after it became a potential hazard for the kids. Landscaping is needed in backyard to allow the children who stay in this building to have an outside play area. There are overgrown trees in the back and side of building that need to be trimmed back. This is causing issues to the fence and roof. Parking lot needs resurfacing and striping. Replace flooring throughout building, it's old, cracking creating a potential safety issue for clients and kids. The last two winters, the HVAC has gone out and space heaters were required. This has to be repaired as women, kids, and infants stay here up to 45 days and need heat. Using space heaters creates more potential safety concerns. This building needs a fire alarm system especially with families sleeping in building. It there is an issue with the space heaters there is no fire alarm system to alert families.

#### Justification

The families staying in the shelter are required to purchase and prepare meals for their families. The shelter needs to have a commercial grade kitchen due to the number of families using the equipment. This equipment needs to last for some years and be energy efficient. Appliances need upgrading, starting with the stovetop electric burners as some are inoperable. County facilities has worked hard to repair them as much as possible. Currently, there is one commercial refrigerator, but with the number of families in the shelter, there needs to be two more added. The residential refrigerators aren't large enough and frequently breakdown. The kitchen cabinets are old and deteriorating and need to be replaced and upgraded with something that provides storage for 20 families. Due to cracks in the stucco at certain angles, rain enters the building along the floor board. It has created mold issues and water damage. The stucco needs to be repaired, water sealed, and the exterior of the building painted. This facility has children living there with their mother for up to 45 days, so they need to have an area to play. The back area has a sandlot area with rocks, sticks and weeds growing in it along with a wooden play structure with unsafe material around it. Recently, the rubber matting started to create potential hazards to the kids, so it was removed. Now this area is in need of landscaping to provide an adequate play area for the kids. The overgrown trees need to be trimmed back and any fence or roof damage needs to assessed and repaired. Branches and limbs falling from trees create a potential safety issue to children playing in the backyard. The parking lot does not have defined parking stalls, and there are small holes in the parking lot. Parking lot needs resurfacing and striping. The flooring throughout the building is old and cracking creating a potential hazard for clients and kids. The building HVAC system needs repair as it has malfunctioned during the last two years during the winter, so this needs to be rep

Goal to have the kitchen appliance upgrade first due to health and safety to families staying at the shelter. Repair the backyard so the children have a safe place to play. Coastal Office 2620 First Ave, Marina, Adult Services - Our staff have moved into the space vacated by Public Guardia and currently need to move into the vacated Grand Jury space. Grand Jury space requires the demolition of the walls to create one large training room to include HVAC upgrade, acoustic panel, fire, security, and cabling allowing the creation of a Virtual training environment to reduce staff travel time and allow for a large meeting room on the Peninsula for staff and the community. Currently this building is the only DSS building without a badge-access system, keys have to be issue to staff for access. Need to add the swipes to the doors with connection to DSS's current system or if the County has this building scheduled with Gentec. Currently ADA accessibility access in only at the front of the building. Most staff entire at the rear side doors of the building add ADA accessibility to these doors. Only having ADA access at the front of the building requires staff and visitors to walk through staff work area to get the back of building. Upgrade interior lighting throughout building to be energy efficient and exterior lighting including parking lot. Repave parking lot and restripe parking stalls.

#### Justification

The Adult Services Branch has 43 employees assigned to this building including Social Workers, Management Analysts, and Clerical support for Aging, Disabled and In Home Support Services. Currently, DSS staff are housed in this building with Supervisor Parker, and Agricultural Commissioner. The Grand Jury has been out of the building for over a year and DS just recently received permission from County Facilities to move into the space. DSS needs more space to add Adult Services Branch in the building resulting in increased customer service and efficient use of staff time reducing traveling to serve the Peninsula community. The creation of a training/meeting room reduces staff travel time and allows community meetings that currently take place in Salinas for all customers. As customers come in for service, accessibility is critical. Most come in with someone assisting them and some have larger size scooters. Adult Services Social Workers arrive at the building at all hours and days and the area is very dark. The building is in a dark isolated area, and there isn't security at all hours nor cameras on the exterior of the building. At times, staff have been frightened by individuals in the abandoned buildings. Adding ADA accessibility at other entrances to the building would aid in serving our customers and provide the security for staff working on confidential PII.

Goal to demolish the walls in vacated Grand Jury space, to include electrical, IT, HVAC, fire, security and lighting, and create a large training room with virtual training capabilities and adding of the badge access system to building doors.
