a. Approve and authorize the Director of Health or Assistant Director of Health to execute a Mental Health Services Agreement for the retroactive term of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023 with Mountain Valley Child and Family Services, Inc. for the provision of mental health and residential services in the amount of \$590,000 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21, \$590,000 for FY 2021-22, and \$590,000 for FY 2022-23, for a total Agreement amount not to exceed \$1,770,000; and b. Approve and authorize the Director of Health or Assistant Director of Health to approve up to three (3) future amendments that do not exceed ten percent (10%) (\$177,000) of the original Agreement amount and do not significantly change the scope of services.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

a. Approve and authorize the Director of Health or Assistant Director of Health to execute a Mental Health Services Agreement for the retroactive term of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023 with Mountain Valley Child and Family Services, Inc. for the provision of mental health and residential services in the amount of \$590,000 for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21, \$590,000 for FY 2021-22, and \$590,000 for FY 2022-23, for a total Agreement amount not to exceed \$1,770,000; and b. Approve and authorize the Director of Health or Assistant Director of Health to approve up to three (3) future amendments that do not exceed ten percent (10%) (\$177,000) of the original Agreement amount and do not significantly change the scope of services.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

This new Mental Health Services Agreement with Mountain Valley Child and Family Services, Inc. replaces Agreement A-13606 which expired June 30, 2020. Mountain Valley Child and Family Services is a Short-term Residential Therapeutic Program (STRTP) providing residential and specialty mental health services including specialized and intensive care, support, and 24-hour supervision on a short-term basis for children and youth with complex and severe needs. The goal of the program is to provide therapeutic interventions to treat and ameliorate the behavioral health symptom and improve function so that children and adolescents may move to a less restrictive and intensive treatment setting. Mountain Valley Child and Family Services, Inc. has been providing services to Monterey County youth who require the highest level of care to prevent their placement into an inpatient hospital or out-of-state residential or juvenile justice facility. This Agreement is late in being presented to your Board due to an inordinate delay in obtaining the review and signatures by the vendor.

This Agreement contains the County's standard 30-day "no cause" provision (Section IV, B) and an additional defunding provision (Section IV, D), which provides the County the ability to amend or terminate the Agreement in the event of a reduction and/or termination of funding.

This work supports the following Monterey County Health Department 2018-2022 Strategic Plan initiative: 3. Ensure access to culturally and linguistically appropriate, customer-friendly, quality health services. It also supports one of the ten essential public health services, specifically: 7. Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provisions of health care when otherwise unavailable. OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel and Auditor-Controller have reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form and fiscal provisions, respectively.

This Agreement is funded by Federal Financial Participation (FFP 6%), 2011 Realignment- Early Periodic Screening and Diagnostic Testing (EPSDT 3%), and Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA 91%) funds that pay for children who are placed through the Individual Education Plan (IEP). The funds for this Agreement are included in the Health Department's Behavioral Health (HEA012, Unit 8410) Fiscal Year (FY) 2020-21 Adopted Budget. The funds for this Agreement for FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23 will be included in the respective Health Department's Behavioral Health (HEA012, Unit 8410) FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23 Requested Budgets.
