

## Resolution No.

Resolution authorizing the County
Administrative Officer to execute a Proposition
64 grant agreement with the Board of State and
Community Corrections to receive grant
funding in the amount of \$996,545 to improve
health outcomes through integrated countywide initiatives utilizing three project purpose
areas associated with the implementation of the
Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of
Marijuana Act: 1) youth development and
prevention; 2) public health; and 3) public
safety with an overarching goal to educate on
the risks of cannabis consumption and illicit
market products

WHEREAS, the members of the Monterey County Board of Supervisors seek continuing efforts to provide public education to all age groups about cannabis use, reducing the unlicensed cannabis market and improving compliance efforts with retail delivery services; and

WHEREAS, funding has been provided by the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) to provide grant funds to local jurisdictions for projects that assist with law enforcement efforts, fire protection efforts, or other local projects addressing public health and safety associated with the implementation of the Control, Regulate and Tax Adult Use of Marijuana Act (AUMA); and

WHEREAS, Monterey County Board of Supervisors supports the continuous development of a public education and compliance program for dispensary/delivery service of the sale of licensed cannabis products to significantly reduce the unlicensed cannabis market; and

WHEREAS, unified strategies that include surveillance, customer and retail education, and enforcement provided by a county wide partnership between the County Health Department (Public Health and Environmental Health Bureaus), Cannabis Compliance Inspection Program, District Attorney's Office and Sheriff's Office.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the County Administrative Officer is authorized to execute the grant agreement with BSCC, including any extensions or amendments thereof and any subsequent grant agreement with BSCC.

IT IS AGREED that any liability arising out of the performance of this grant agreement, including civil court actions for damages, shall be the responsibility of the grant recipient and the authorizing agency. The BSCC and State of California disclaim responsibility for any such liability.
