- Monterey County boxes
 - Placed following security measures in Election Code and Regulations
 - Retrieval processes follow or exceed regulations

- Shared intelligence with local law enforcement agencies and ITD Security Team

COVID-19 AND VOTING SAFETY

COVID-19 AND VOTING SAFETY

- All voters are asked to wear a face covering/mask and to practice social distancing while voting to protect all that are in the polling place.
 - Voters preferring not to wear a face covering can be assisted curbside or in an outdoor voting area
- Sanitation protocol in place for high touch surfaces
- All poll workers will be given masks, face shields and gloves.
- All employees are required to wear a mask and face shields when working in teams
- Gloves are required when working with ballots
- Partitions and table coverings are provided at each polling place and the early vote location
- Partitions were installed in the office
- Staff/volunteers take COVID safety training from county and SOS
- Hand sanitizer and cleaning supplies are at each location
- Local and state observer guidelines were updated to include health and safety protocol



OBSERVER RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

- The website has an observer calendar which lists dates of various events they can observe.
- Observers will have to follow health and safety guidelines and may have to take turns observing or wait until voter traffic allows for safe observation
- Observers are encouraged to contact MCE to discuss trainings, materials, and what to expect given COVID-19 health and safety guidelines







DEPARTMENT STRATEGY

- In 2016 MC Elections developed a strategic plan to prepare the department for immediate and future challenges to the administration of election.

 - Changed voting system
 - Changed accessible marking devices
 - Changed election management system
 - Modernized vote by mail processing system
