## **School Reopening Criteria**


## **Reopening Eligibility Window**

Schools have a **three-week period to open**, starting the day the county meets the criterion for reopening, even if the county stops meeting the criterion during that window (i.e., case rate is  $\geq$  25 in a subsequent calculation...).


### **Reopening in the Red Tier**

For all K-12 schools in a county in the Purple Tier, **all** schools are eligible to re-open all grade levels the day the county is considered in the Red Tier (which is on the day after the assignment is posted; assignments are posted on Tuesdays, so the school may re-open on the Wednesday).

### **COVID-19 Safety Plan**



### Key Considerations:

- 1. Required by the California Department of Public Health
- If the district has reopened, post the COVID-19 Safety Plan to website by February 1.
- 3. For reopening in Yellow, Orange or Red, post CSP at least five days prior to providing inperson instruction
- 4. For reopening in the Purple tier, complete these additional requirements:
  - a. Must consult with labor, parents and community organizations
  - Must submit COVID-19 Safety Plan to both Monterey County Public Health and the State School Safety for All Team for review

- Evaluate employees' potential workplace exposures to all persons at, or who may enter, our workplace.
- Review applicable orders and general and industry-specific guidance from the State of California Cal/OSHA, and the local health department related to COVID-19 hazards and provention.
- Evaluate existing COVID-19 prevention controls in our workplace and the need for different or additional controls.
   Conduct periodic inspections using the Appendix B: COVID-19 Inspections form as needed to
- Conduct periodic inspections using the Appendix B: COVID-9 Inspections form as needed t identify unheality conditions, work practices, and work procedures related to COVID-19 and to ensure compliance with our COVID-19 policies and procedures.
- Enter other identification and evaluation measures you take in your workplace

#### Employee participation

Employees and their authorized employees' representatives are encouraged to participate in the identification and evaluation of COVID-19 hazards by: [Describe how employees and their representatives, if any, may participate in COVID-19 hazard identification and evaluation.]

#### Employee screening

### Key Considerations:

- 1. Required by the Division of Occupational Safety and Health (DOSH) (better known as Cal/OSHA)
- Goal of the CAL/OSHA COVID-19 Emergency Temporary standards is for "employers to take steps to protect <u>workers</u> exposed to infectious diseases"
- 2. Determine if your district will modify the Illness & Injury Prevention Plan or create a separate COVID-19 Prevention Program
- Rely on Human Resources expertise in your district to meet requirements <u>as an</u> <u>employer</u>

## Vaccines

- The Governor has announced that beginning March 1st, 10% of vaccines will be set aside for childcare and K-12 employees
- This is in addition to what our county currently receive
- Awaiting details on prioritization from the State

## **Youth Sports Guidance**

- Note: The following guidance takes effect on February 26, 2021.
- Outdoor high-contact sports (orange tier) can be played in the purple or red tier with an <u>adjusted case rate equal to or less than 14 per 100,000</u> under the following conditions:
  - Informed consent
  - Testing antigen or PCR (regular and postseason antigen or PCR testing of sports participants and coaches weekly. If competing, testing performed with test results made available within 24 hours of play.)
  - When adjusted case rates for the county are between 14-7 per 100,000 weekly testing is required.
