- Increased testing is critical in order for us to advance through the tiers
- Testing needs to be counted on the state level as part of the linear adjustment factor
- Adjusting the population base to include migrant workforce plays a factor in our ability to re-open
- Santa Barbara we are watching their numbers closely



- According to the new Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance, hotel workers across the US should have earlier access to the COVID-19 vaccines. In the recently updated vaccine distribution guidance, "Travel Accommodation" was prioritized in the essential workers category elevating hotel workers to Phase 1c.
- We estimate we need 10,000 vaccines to vaccinate the balance of our hospitality workers



Re-opening for the Monterey County Hospitality industry and the health of our community municipalities has reached a crisis point

- Travelers are planning their vacations now
- Travelers are choosing destinations that are perceived safe
- Travelers are looking at options such as indoor dining and other indoor activities i.e., The Monterey Bay Aquarium
- We are losing group business and weddings to other destinations
- Our competitors are actively marketing they are "safe" and "open", even if they are in the red tier



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
