

NEW AND EVOLVING UNFUNDED MANDATES REQUIRING A CONVICTION REVIEW ATTORNEY

Current Unfunded Mandates

- Habeas Review Review process allows for new evidence to be reevaluated. Recent case resulted in a murder charge being dismissed by prosecution.
- Certificates of Rehabilitation and Pardon Requests
- <u>Conviction Integrity</u>- Review claims of wrongful conviction. Time Consuming.
- <u>Clemency Review</u> Review prior sentences for possible reduction. PC1170(d)(1). Discretionary.
- Felony Murder Reform
- Racial Justice Act

<u>Upcoming Post-Conviction Criminal Justice Reform Bills</u>

 Remove finality of judgements – Literally opens up every conviction that has ever occurred in California to new litigation without allocating any funding to pay for the new litigation

*** If this does pass, it will also significantly impact the Public Defender's office as well.

DEPARTMENT INFORMATION SYSTEM COORDINATOR

- 16,000-19,000 cases processed each year
 - Electronic evidence: body Cams, 911 recordings, photographs
 - LE is increasing their use of body Cams
- 8,000 Truancy referrals
 - School transcripts, attendance records, Probation reports
- New transparency laws
 - Investigations regarding findings of officer dishonesty, use of force, and sexual assault
 - Officer involved shootings including reports, findings and associated digital media

- Our digital management system requires full time assistance
 - Operational
 - Secure State and Federal Guidelines
 - Interface with the Court, Public Defender, Sheriff, Probation, two prisons, municipal, state and law enforcement partners – On a daily basis
 - Currently we have three administrative positions in house trying to wrestle the digital management of our office
 - IT provides assistance as well
