Chief Roger Rinehart began his career in 1999 with the City of Pismo Beach Fire Department as a Reserve Firefighter. In 2003, he became a Paramedic and worked for American Medical Response (AMR) Ambulance Company in Santa Barbara County. After gaining experience with AMR, he went to work for the San Luis Ambulance Service where he still works today part-time as a Paramedic.

In 2007, Chief Rinehart accepted a Limited Term (LT) Firefighter II (Paramedic) position in the San Luis Obispo Unit (SLU) and worked at the Los Osos Fire Station. In 2010, he accepted a Firefighter II position in the San Benito-Monterey Unit (BEU), and in 2011, he went back to San Luis as a Fire Apparatus Engineer. In 2012, he accepted a Fire Apparatus Engineer (Paramedic) position in San Luis.
