WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 in order to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of Monterey County are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, Monterey County must adopt by resolution a list of all projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, Monterey County is estimated to receive \$8.8 million in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2021-22 from SB 1; and

WHEREAS, this is the fifth year in which Monterey County is receiving SB 1 funding which will enable Monterey County to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, Monterey County has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities; and

WHEREAS, Monterey County developed the SB 1 project list based on its 2019 Pavement Management Program to ensure revenues are being used on the most high priority and cost effective projects that also meet Monterey County priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the funding from SB 1 will help Monterey County maintain and rehabilitate roads and bridges throughout the County this year and other similar projects into the future; and

WHEREAS, the 2019 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that Monterey County's streets and roads are in "poor" condition and RMRA revenue will help increase the overall quality of the road system and, over the next decade, will bring streets and roads into a "good" condition; and

WHEREAS, without revenue from SB 1, Monterey County would have otherwise been deferring and/or canceling projects throughout the County and/or laying off County staff; and

WHEREAS, without SB 1 funding, county roads would have continued to deteriorate, having many and varied negative impacts on the community; and

WHEREAS, the County of Monterey owns and maintains approximately 1200 centerline miles of roads and 174 bridges that the people and traveling public depend on for a safe, reliable local transportation network; and

WHEREAS, modernizing the local street and road system provides well paying construction jobs and boosts local economies; and

WHEREAS, the local street and road system is also critical for farm to market needs, interconnectivity, multimodal needs, and commerce; and

WHEREAS, police, fire, and emergency medical services all need safe reliable roads to react quickly to emergency calls and a few minutes of delay can be a matter of life and death; and

WHEREAS, maintaining and preserving the local street and road system in good condition will reduce drive times and traffic congestion, improve bicycle safety, and make the pedestrian experience safer and more appealing, which leads to reduced vehicle emissions helping the State achieve its air quality and greenhouse gas emission reduction goals; and

WHEREAS, restoring roads before they fail also reduces construction time which results in less air pollution from heavy equipment and less water pollution from site run-off; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Monterey, State of California, that said Board:
