Interim, Inc. is providing street outreach specifically in unincorporated areas of the County and can refer homeless individuals to temporary housing provided by the Coalition using the recommended funding.			
Max's Helping Paws Foundation (\$148k requested) is considered a subsistence payment. Because it is not a payment for an income-qualified household to remain housed or keep utilities connected, it is not an eligible activity.
