


Lake San Antonio North Shore Outdoor Amphitheater Design


Lake San Antonio Amphitheater Cost

- Estimated Project \$3,000,000
 - Funded by Prop. 68 grant no match required
- Estimated Annual Operation & Maintenance \$114,000
 - New staff four (4) Seasonal Park Aides
 - Cost to be recovered from additional camping and concession revenue

Lake San Antonio South Shore Marina

- Replace existing "condemned" marina with new marina and fuel system
- Key features:
 - ✓ New fuel tank
 - √ Fuel dispenser
 - ✓ 50 slip marina
 - ✓ Store/kiosk
- Two possible locations:
 - ✓ Harris Creek
 - ✓ Lynch








- Previous marina location
- Topography significantly better for marina movement, walkway etc.
- Lynch is significantly shallower and water levels recede at 13% capacity
 - Marina would need to be moved to Harris Creek below 13% capacity
- Existing infrastructure may need to be relocated before spillway modification



Lake San Antonio Marina Cost

- Estimated Project Cost \$3,000,000
 - Funded by Prop. 68 grant no match required
- Estimated Annual Operation & Maintenance \$55,000
 - Anticipated annual revenue: \$401,000
