They had a really good turnout in Big Sur and Carmel Valley as the residents are so concerned and engaged on these issues especially in terms of

fire hazards. They really appreciated the opportunity to have their voices heard. Secondly, she thanked those that turned out for her most recent Fireside Chat. She had a good turnout of about 30 people at each event and they may have to go to a larger venue for the next ones. Finally, they had a terrific event on the Monterey peninsula this past weekend called Whalefest. It was a terrific day, Saturday was great as the weather was nice, Sunday was a little colder but there were still a lot of people enjoying the events that took place. All of the focus was on whales and saving the ocean. There was a man that wrote an adorable book for children called Sip the Straw which is a really good introduction for one of the items on our agenda today which is the difficulty we have with single use plastics. It was a good weekend all in al.

Supervisor John M. Phillips commented on the apprehension and arrest on the projectile case. They worked with the Highway Patrol and the Sheriff's office and as he mentioned at the press conference these types of crimes have no witnesses, no motive over a big piece of time which are difficult. There was a lot of dedicated, hard investigative work done and the High Patrol and Sheriff's office should be commended as they made it safer for all. He commented a number of people that were taking alternate routes to avoid these situations. This was a nice resolution and fortunately no one got injured if you think about it people are driving 65 miles per hour and your window gets blown and how would you react to that, so this was a great resolution.
