The additional HICAP funding can be used for volunteer recruitment, training, beneficiary counseling, group and media outreach and education.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Auditor-Controller and Purchasing have reviewed and approved this agreement. County Counsel has approved the agreement as to form.

FINANCING:

Funding is provided by the Federal Older Americans Act and the California Department of Aging. Sufficient appropriations and estimated revenues of \$665,916 for the Area Agency on Aging's Fund 001-5010-SOC010 are included in the Fiscal Year 2022-23 Adopted Budget and the remaining funds of \$8,054 has been included in next years' budget request.
