



founded on the belief that parents serve as a child's first and most influential teachers, and that effective parenting during a child's early years builds a lasting foundation for success in school and life. This service is provided on a one-on-one basis for children ages 0-5, and includes hands-on instruction by certified Parent Educators with a focus on enhancing the parents' knowledge of child development and parenting skills. Expansion of this program allows for greater emphasis on engaging with families prior to formal intervention with the Child Welfare system, a primary prevention and family well-being service. Currently services are being provided according to safety protocols and will change as conditions permit.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Auditor-Controller and Purchasing have reviewed and approved this agreement. County Counsel has approved the agreement as to form.

FINANCING:

This agreement is fully funded with Social Services Federal and State revenues and Realignment funds. Sufficient appropriations and estimated revenues for SOCOO5 are included in the FY 2021-22 Recommended Budget. Future fiscal year costs will be requested through the corresponding budget process.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS STRATEGIC INITIATIVES:

This amendment correlates to the Health & Human Services Strategic Initiative adopted by the Board of Supervisors by allowing the Department to improve the quality of life for families by providing interactive parent education services to families in need of, or at risk of child protective services intervention.
