

provide intensive wraparound services to eligible Monterey County Foster and Probation Ward youth. These services are defined as community-based intervention services that emphasize the strengths of the child and family, and include the delivery of coordinated, highly individualized unconditional services to address needs and achieve positive outcomes in their lives. The goal of “Wraparound” is to provide mental health and supportive services that stabilize and enable clients to either return home or move to a lower level of care by “wrapping” a comprehensive array of custom fit and individualized services.

This work supports the Monterey County Health Department 2011-2015 Strategic Plan initiative to empower the community to improve health through programs, policies, and activities. It also supports one or more of the ten essential public health services, specifically: Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provisions of health care when otherwise unavailable.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel and Auditor-Controller have reviewed and approved this Agreement as to legal form and fiscal provisions, respectively. A copy of Amendment 1 is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

FINANCING:

This Agreement is funded by Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (25%), Federal Financial Participation (30%), Realignment (5%), and Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) (40%) funds that pay for children who are placed through the Individual Education Plan (IEP). The amount of Amendment No. 1 to Agreement A-12492 is \$582,429 for FY 2013-14, \$1,066,549 for FY 2014-15 and \$1,066,549 for FY 2015-16 for a total amount not to exceed \$5,710,298. The funds for this Agreement are included in the Health Department’s Behavioral Health Bureau (HEA012, Unit 8410) Adopted Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-14.
