



risk of residential treatment. HART services provide highly individualized, intensive case management and one-to-one behavioral intervention that address the social emotional needs presenting barriers to academic success. This Amendment will provide additional resources to the Monterey County educational system to serve children with emotional needs.

This work supports the Monterey County Health Department 2011-2015 Strategic Plan initiative to empower the community to improve health through programs, policies, and activities. It also supports one or more of the ten essential public health services, specifically: Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provisions of health care when otherwise unavailable.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

County Counsel and Auditor-Controller have reviewed and approved this Amendment No. 1 to Agreement A-12259 as to legal form and fiscal provisions, respectively. Amendment is on file with the Clerk of the Board.

FINANCING:

This Agreement is funded by Federal Financial Participation (46%), Realignment (47%), and Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) (7%) funds that pay for children who are placed through the Individual Education Plan (IEP). The amount of Amendment No. 1 to Agreement A-12259 is \$71,288 for FY 2013-14 and \$149,225 for FY 2014-15 for a total amount not to exceed \$1,034,318. The funds for this Amendment are included in the Health Department's Behavioral Health Bureau (HEA012, Unit 8410) Adopted Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-14, and FY 2014-15 Requested Budget.
