



has served 115 youth. Nearly, 75% of these 115 youth came into the program in a condition of homelessness, near homelessness, or had experienced homelessness in the months prior to entering THP+.

Reviewing data from the 32 youth who have participated in the THP+ foster care since January 2015 shows that 31% entered THP+ in a condition of homelessness, near homelessness, or had experienced homelessness in the months prior to entering THP+. While in THP+, 69% of the 32 youth obtained or remained employed during their tenure in THP+. Close to 47% of the 32 youth were enrolled in higher education and matriculating towards an associates, bachelors, or vocational certificate while in the program. Of the 14 youth who have exited the program since January 2015, 13 (or 94%) exited or transitioned into stable housing. This is a 14% increase from the previous contract year.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Auditor-Controller and Purchasing have reviewed and approved this agreement. County Counsel has approved the agreement as to form.

FINANCING:

This agreement is funded with 2011 Tax Realignment revenues. Sufficient appropriations and estimated revenues are included in SOC001 in the FY 2016-17 Recommended Budget. There is no impact to the County General Fund contributions.
