Approve and authorize the Director of Health, the Assistant Director of Health, or the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency Director, to execute Renewal and Amendment No. 5 to the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement with Monterey County Regional Fire District (MCRFD) to extend the Agreement on the same terms and conditions to retroactive from January 31, 2022 through July 31, 2022.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

Approve and authorize the Director of Health, the Assistant Director of Health, or the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency Director, to execute Renewal and Amendment No. 5 to the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement with Monterey County Regional Fire District (MCRFD) to extend the Agreement on the same terms and conditions to retroactive from January 31, 2022 through July 31, 2022.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency is designated under California law by Monterey County as the local Emergency Medical Services Agency responsible for planning, implementing, and evaluating the local EMS system throughout Monterey County. Under California law, no person or organization may provide “advanced life support,” also known as “paramedic services,” unless that person or organization is an authorized part of the emergency medical service system of the local EMS agency.

Accordingly, under California law, a paramedic service provider must have a written agreement with the local EMS agency to participate in the EMS system and to comply with all applicable state regulations and local policies and procedures, including participation in the local EMS agency’s Continuous Quality Improvement (“CQI”) program.

The original Paramedic Service Provider Agreement was reviewed and approved by the Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC) on September 14, 2011 and by the Monterey County Board of Supervisors on

November 1, 2011. The Paramedic Service Provider Agreement with Monterey County Regional Fire District was executed on March 28, 2012 for a period of four (4) years.

On March 7, 2017, the Monterey County Board of Supervisors approved and authorized the EMS Agency Director to execute an amendment to extend this Paramedic Service Provider Agreement retroactive to March 28, 2016 up to June 30, 2017 (Agreement to Retroactively Renew Agreement). On June 27, 2017, the Board approved and authorized the EMS Agency Director to execute Amendment No. 2 to extend this Paramedic Service Provider Agreement for another year through June 30, 2018. On June 26, 2018, the Board approved and authorized the EMS Agency Director to execute Amendment No. 3 to extend this Paramedic Service Provider Agreement to June 30, 2020. And on January 28, 2020, the Board approved and authorized the EMS Agency Director to execute Amendment No. 4 to extend this Paramedic Service Provider Agreement to January 31, 2022. The Agreement expired on January 31, 2022. MCRFD has proposed changes to the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement. The short extension of the agreement is needed to allow the EMS Agency time to review the proposed changes and to execute a new amendment.

Monterey County Regional Fire District asserts it has status as California Health and Safety Code Section 1797.201 jurisdiction; meaning that it would not be required to have a paramedic service provider agreement to provide paramedic services, if it maintains its 1797.201 status. The EMS Agency believes it is more desirable to have a limited medical control agreement rather than not having an agreement. Therefore, parties wish to amend the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement to extend it through January 31, 2022.

This work supports the Monterey County Health Department 2018-2022 Strategic Plan Initiatives: 2. Enhance public health and safety through prevention; and 4. Engage MCHD workforce and improve operational functions to meet current and developing population health needs. It also supports one of the ten essential public health services, specifically: 7. Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provision of health care when otherwise unavailable.
