

services to children under age 21 with CCS-eligible medical conditions. Examples of CCS-eligible conditions include, but are not limited to, chronic medical conditions such as cystic fibrosis, hemophilia, cerebral palsy, heart disease, cancer, traumatic injuries, and infectious diseases producing major sequelae. CCS also provides medical therapy services at local public schools. Health and Safety Code, Section 123800 et seq. is the enabling statute for the CCS program.

The California Children's Services Medical Consultant services as a member of the CCS team of public health professionals dedicated to assuring the highest quality medical care for the children of Monterey County with special medical needs. The Medical Consultant determines medical eligibility for the program and, in some cases, determines benefit eligibility. State CCS Regulations and Numbered Letters provide the framework for local CCS program eligibility determinations and require medical interpretation for consistent decision making. The Medical Consultant participates in state and regional CCS working groups to ensure consistent application of State guidance across the state. The Medical Consultant is also a member of the CCS Medical Therapy Program, whose clinics are MediCal Certified Outpatient Rehabilitation Centers that provide medically necessary physical and occupational therapy to CCS clients. As such, the Medical Consultant participates in required utilization review and performs yearly annual review and medical eligibility determinations.

It also supports the following of the ten essential public health services, specifically: 8. Assure competent public and personal health care workforce.
