RECOMMENDATION:

SUMMARY:

The Health Department seeks authorization to execute Amendment No. 2 to extend the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement with Pebble Beach Community Services District on the same terms and conditions to June 30, 2018.

DISCUSSION:

The Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency is designated under California law by Monterey County as the local Emergency Medical Services Agency responsible for planning, implementing, and evaluating the local EMS system throughout Monterey County. Under California law, no person or organization may provide "advanced life support," also known as "paramedic services," unless that person or organization is an authorized part of the emergency medical service system of the local EMS agency.

Accordingly, under California law, a paramedic service provider must have a written agreement with the local EMS agency to participate in the EMS system and to comply with all applicable state regulations and local policies and procedures, including participation in the local EMS agency's Continuous Quality Improvement ("CQI") program.

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The original Paramedic Service Provider Agreement was reviewed and approved by the Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC) on September 14, 2011 and by the Monterey County Board of Supervisors on November 1, 2011. The Paramedic Service Provider Agreement with Pebble Beach Community Services District was executed on January 27, 2012 for a period of four (4) years.

On March 7, 2017, the Monterey County Board of Supervisors approved and authorized the EMS Agency Director to execute an amendment to extend this Paramedic Service Provider Agreement retroactive to January 27, 2016 up through June 30, 2017 (Agreement to Retroactively Renew Agreement) to allow time to review and, if needed, revise the agreement to reflect the landscape of our current EMS system.

A new agreement that reflects the landscape of our current EMS system is still being drafted and negotiated. Therefore, parties wish to amend the Paramedic Service Provider Agreement to extend it through June 30, 2018 to allow time for the execution of a new agreement that reflects the landscape of our current EMS system.

This work is not directly in support of a Health Department strategic initiative, it is in support of one or more of the ten essential public health services, specifically: 7) Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provision of health care when otherwise unavailable.
