RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

a. Approve and authorize the Director of Health or Assistant Director of Health to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with Monterey County Special Education Local Plan Area for reimbursement to the County for the provision of mental health and residential treatment services for a total amount not to exceed \$2,808,658.27 effective July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018, subject to further review and approval of County Counsel, County Risk Manager, and County-Auditor Controller; and

b. Accept the Director of Health's recommendation to incorporate non-standard indemnification and insurance provisions; and

c. Approve and authorize the Director of Health or Assistant Director of Health to approve up to three (3) future amendments that do not exceed ten percent (10%) (\$280,865.82) of the original Memorandum of

Understanding amount and do not significantly change the scope of services.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA) acknowledges that its member Local Education Agencies are mandated to provide students a free and appropriate public education (FAPE), including mental health services, Home Alternative to Residential Treatment services and residential placements pursuant to students' Individualized Education Plan (IEP). For a number of years SELPA entered into a MOU with the Monterey County Behavioral Health Bureau (MCBHB) for the provision of these services to special education students and seeks to continue its partnership with MCBHB. Through this MOU, MCBHB will deploy Psychiatric Social Workers ("Therapist") School Districts to provide an array of services including individual and group counseling provided to a student; individual or group counseling provided to parents of special education students. SELPA agrees to pay the non-Federal Financial Participation (FFP) portion of the therapists' costs up to the total maximum funding amount since MCBHB is reimbursed FFP directly by Department of Health Care Services; and reimburse the full cost of the provision of HART and Residential Treatment services.

The MOU between SELPA and the County expired on June 30, 2017. Since prior to the expiration of the former MOU, the MCBHB has been working on the new MOU with the SELPA, which is currently undergoing final negotiations to the insurance and indemnification provisions, which are not the standard County provisions. To ensure continuity in the provision of services pursuant to students' IEP, the Department seeks authorization to execute a MOU with SELPA effective July 1, 2017 subject to further review and approval of County Counsel, County Risk Manager, and County Auditor Controller.

This work supports the following Monterey County Health Department 2011-2015 Strategic Plan initiative: 3) Ensure access to culturally and linguistically appropriate, customer-friendly, quality health services. It also supports one of the ten essential public health services, specifically: 7) Link people to needed personal health services and assure the provisions of health care when otherwise unavailable.

The Monterey County Behavioral Health Bureau, Health Department prepared this report.

FINANCING:

The costs of this agreement are funded by Special Education Local Plan Area reimbursement (SELPA 100%). The associated revenue and expenditures, \$2,808,658.27, are included in the Health Department's Behavioral Health (HEA 012, Unit 8410) Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-18 Adopted Budget.
