Adopt an Ordinance Amending Chapter 2.59 of the Monterey County Code relating to the Monterey County Children and Families Commission's term limits for at large members.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors:

Adopt an ordinance amending Chapter 2.59 of the Monterey County Code to clarify that at large members of the Monterey County Children and Families Commission may serve until a successor is appointed and that, in the case of at large members appointed to fill a vacancy, they may serve the remainder of an unexpired term in addition to two additional consecutive three-year terms.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

Existing County regulations permit at large members to serve up to two consecutive three-year terms. This ordinance amends the regulations to clarify that at large members may continue to serve until a successor is appointed. In the case of an at large member appointed to fill a vacancy, they may serve the remainder of an unexpired term, in addition to two additional consecutive three-year terms.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

FINANCING:

The proposed amendment to Chapter 2.59 will not incur additional expenses.
