Board of Supervisors Modifications to the FY 2025-26 Recommended Budget

The items listed below were directed by the Board of Supervisors (Board) as modifications to the FY 2025-26 Recommended Budget during the May 28, 2025, Budget Hearings.

- 1. Increase appropriations in the Department of Emergency Management (1001-104001) by \$15,911 to support the reallocation of a current Management Analyst II position to a Management Analyst III position, funded by the Contingency Reserve.
- 2. Restore 1.0 vacant Management Analyst II position in the Department of Emergency Management (1001-104001), to remain unfunded.
- 3. Increase appropriations in the County Administrative Office (1001-105006) by \$25,000 to fund the County's communication efforts, funded by the Contingency Reserve.
- 4. Increase appropriations in the County Administrative Office (1001-105014) by \$3,174,720 to provide an Operating Transfer In to the Road Fund (1201) to offset a reduction in the contribution level from the Transient Occupancy Tax, funded by \$1,236,288 from the Contingency Reserve, \$1,673,966 in Measure AA revenues, and \$264,466 from the Cannabis Assignment.

- 17. Increase appropriations in Elections (1001-141001) by \$1,440,000 for department operations managing the June 2026 primary election, funded by a reduction of \$1,440,000 to the appropriation for Contingencies (1001-105011).
- 18. Restore 4.0 vacant Deputy District Attorney IV positions in the District Attorney's Office (1001-224001), to remain unfunded.
- 19. Increase appropriations in the District Attorney's Office (1001-224002) by \$335,303 to restore three vacant Deputy District Attorney IV positions, funded by the Contingency Reserve.
- 20. Restore 1.0 vacant Deputy District Attorney IV positions in the District Attorney's Office (1001-224002), to remain unfunded.
- 21. Increase appropriations in the Sheriff-Coroner's Office (1001-230005) by \$568,528 to restore three vacant Deputy Sheriff-Operations positions, funded with Measure AA revenues.
- 22. Restore 4.0 vacant Deputy Sheriff Operations positions in the Sheriff-Coroner's Office (1001-230005), to remain unfunded.
- 23. Restore 1.0 vacant Deputy Sheriff Operations position in the Sheriff-Coroner's Office (1001-230006), to remain unfunded.
- 24. Increase appropriations in Public Works, Facilities and Parks (1001-320002) by \$178,250 to fund custodial services in multi-use facilities, funded by the Contingency Reserve.

- 28. Restore 1.0 vacant Senior Secretary position in Public Works, Facilities and Parks (1001-320010), to remain unfunded.
- 29. Increase appropriations and revenues in Public Works, Facilities and Parks (1201-320015) of \$3,174,720 to receive an Operating Transfer In from the General Fund to restore the contribution to 25% of Transient Occupancy Tax revenue.
- 30. Increase appropriations in Health (1001-400018) by \$26,780 to provide an Operating Transfer Out to fund the Animal Services Spay and Neuter Clinic, funded by Measure AA revenues.
- 31. Increase appropriations of \$52,000 and revenues of \$25,220 in Health (1380-400003) to fund the Animal Services Spay and Neuter Clinic, funded by program revenue and an Operating Transfer In from the General Fund of \$26,780.
- 32. Increase appropriations by \$114,556 in Health (1001-400018) to fund one new Animal Control Officer position to support the Hitchcock Road Animal Services Joint Powers Agreement (JPA), funded by an interfund reimbursement.
- 33. Increase appropriations by \$63,701 in Health (1001-400018) to fund one new Animal Care Technician II position to support the Hitchcock Road Animal Services JPA, funded by an interfund reimbursement.
- 34. Increase appropriations by \$57,974 in Health (1001-400018) to fund one new Office Assistant II position to support the Hitchcock Road Animal Services JPA, funded by an interfund reimbursement.
- 35. Increase appropriations by \$119,126 in Health (1001-400018) to fund one new Management Analyst I position to support the Hitchcock Road Animal Services JPA, funded by an interfund reimbursement.

- 36. Increase appropriations in Health (1001-400018) by \$180,842 to provide an Operating Transfer Out from the General Fund to the Hitchcock Road Animal Services JPA Fund (1380-400003) to fund the County's share of the salary and benefits of positions supporting the Hitchcock Road Animal Services JPA, funded by Measure AA revenues.

Increase appropriations and revenues in Health (1380-400003) by \$355,357 to support the reclassification of salary and benefits costs for positions that support the Hitchcock Road Animal Services JPA, financed by department revenue of \$174,515 and an Operating Transfer In from the General Fund of \$180,842.
- 38. Increase appropriations by \$116,614 and revenues by \$58,307 in Department of Social Services (1001-501007) to restore one vacant Employment and Training Worker III position, funded by department revenue and \$58,307 from the Contingency Reserve.
- 39. Increase appropriations by \$181,716 and revenues by \$90,858 in Department of Social Services (1001-501007) to restore two vacant Social Services Aide II positions, funded by department revenue and \$90,858 from the Contingency Reserve.
- 40. Increase appropriations and revenues in Public Works, Facilities and Parks (1001-320002) by \$1,000,000 to fund unscheduled maintenance activities, funded by an Operating Transfer In from the Building Improvement and Replacement Fund (2205).

Increase appropriations in the County Administrative Office (2205-105024) Building Improvement and Replacement Fund by \$13,490,853 to provide Operating Transfers Out for numerous Capital Improvement Projects in Fund 1930 and unscheduled maintenance to complete needed repairs, replacements, and improvements to county-owned facilities.
