 - Guest serving, revenue driving, and compliance oriented infrastructure and facility repairs



Playground Renovations

- The seven (7) playgrounds at Toro, Royal Oaks and San Lorenzo Parks are nearly 30 years old
 - Reservation areas near the playgrounds are reserved and rented most often
 - Annual repairs of \$50-100K, difficulty in acquiring parts and lack of inclusive play
 - · Renovations would include: playground upgrade, all-access surfacing and inclusive to all

Kitchen Facility Remodeling

- Youth Overnight Areas (YONA) and rental facility kitchens are outdated and damaged, five (5) total
 - Kitchens are industrial-style, with damaged appliances, broken fixtures and utility issues
 - Used heavily for scouting events, family gatherings and large groups of 200-400 guests









Infrastructure & Facility Repairs

- Lake San Antonio South Shore and Laguna Seca **Recreation Area** water system currently out of compliance with State mandates which could force a shutdown of water systems causing campgrounds to close resulting in major facility impacts and loss of revenue, projects to entail replacement of filtration system and/or installation of new treatment plant *County is obligated to complete the water project at LSRA according to Concessionaire Agreement
- Lake San Antonio and San Lorenzo Park restrooms and showers need major repairs and remodeling, some are currently not in service due to significant damage





Additional Park Projects

- Baseball field improvement and soccer goals at Royal Oaks Park, \$300K
- Royal Oaks Park, Toro Park and Lake San Antonio disc golf courses, \$25K each
 - Water park/splash pad at San Lorenzo Park, \$300K
 - Lake San Antonio North Shore amphitheater, \$2M
 - Repair and remodel Lake San Antonio stores, \$500K-\$2M
 - Repair and repave park roads and parking lots, \$15M plus



Total Initial Request

Parks is recommending to fund the following high impact projects to be completed in FY25/26 with a combination of contractor, staff and volunteer labor: San Lorenzo and Royal Oaks Parks Playground Replacements (4 total) - \$1.2M Royal Oaks Disc Golf Course (replace temporary assets) - \$25K Lake San Antonio and San Lorenzo Park Kitchens Remodel (3 total)- \$500K San Lorenzo Park Shower Building Remodel - \$100K Lake San Antonio South Shore Water System (consultant and design) - \$300K LSRA Potable Drinking Water System (30% plans completed, funding for plan completion)-

\$300K
