Adopt a Resolution to:

Receive a report regarding funded partners impacted by the passage of Proposition 1 and the implementation of the Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA) starting July 1, 2026; and

Authorize and direct the Auditor-Controller to amend the Health Department's FY 2026-27 Adopted Budget by increasing Budget Unit 400005 - Behavioral Health appropriations in the amount of \$580,000 to provide one-time gap funding support to three identified providers impacted by the transition of Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) funding under the former Mental Health Services Act (MHSA); and

Provide direction to staff regarding potential next steps related to gap funding for impacted partners.

WHEREAS, proposition 1, approved by California voters in March 2024, enacted the Behavioral Health Services Act (BHSA), restructuring California's behavioral health financing and service delivery system; and

WHEREAS, the BHSA transitions Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) activities from county-administered funding to a statewide Population-Based Prevention model administered by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), resulting in funding impacts to local community-based organizations in Monterey County; and

WHEREAS, the County of Monterey Health Department, Behavioral Health Bureau engaged impacted providers through individual meetings, stakeholder processes, and BHSA community planning efforts to support communication and transition planning; and

WHEREAS, during FY 2026-27 Budget Hearings and related BHSA updates, the Board of Supervisors directed County Administrative Office (CAO) and Behavioral Health Bureau staff to review impacted providers and identify potential gap-funding needs; and

WHEREAS, based on Board criteria, staff identified three providers—Alliance on Aging, Center for Community Advocacy, and The Village Project—as eligible for one-time General Fund contingency support totaling \$580,000 to sustain limited services during FY 2026-27 while seeking alternative funding sources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF MONTEREY,

1. Authorizes and directs the Auditor-Controller to amend the Fiscal Year 2026-27 Behavioral Health Adopted Budget, Fund - Behavioral Health, Budget Unit - Behavioral Health (1310-400005), to increase appropriations by \$580,000, financed by an operating transfer from General Fund - Contingencies (1001-105011) of \$580,000 (4/5ths vote required)) (4/5<sup>th</sup> vote).
