Housing Element Implementation Priority 1

<u>Project</u> – Implement Housing Element "Policies and Programs" that address constraints on housing development

- Stay compliant on Housing Element Certification
 - Improve on Permit Streamlining Goals
 - Multiple long-range work program items can be completed at one time
 - Implementation will make the County eligible for "Pro-housing designation"

Pro-housing provides eligibility for grant funding programs and increased competitive grant opportunities (HAPP 7 funding for example)

<u>Timing</u> – Concurrent with and following certification of the Housing Element FY 26/27 - \$650,000

Housing Element Implementation

- Affordable Housing Strategy
- Housing rehabilitation program
- Updates to allow employer sponsored housing
- Manufactured homes, duplexes, mobile homes and small lot developments ("missing middle")
- Enhanced Infrastructure Finance Districts (EIFDs)
- Emergency Shelter, Navigation Centers, Supportive Housing and Group Home updates to zoning code
- SB4; SB35, SB423; and SB9 Implementation
- Ministerial Approval Process for qualifying developments
- Expedited Processing Strategy for qualifying developments
- Objective Design Standards
- Density Bonus program exceeding state law
- Comprehensive list of incentives and concessions
- Long-term rental incentives
- Outreach, education, and information improvements
- Software programs for monitoring housing resources and connecting public to resources

Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) Priority 2

<u>Project</u> – Consulting services to satisfy CEQA requirements associated with establishing new BESS regulations

FY26 - \$100,000

Fire Preparedness Priority 3

<u>Project</u> – Update County codes and information related to home hardening improvements and vegetation management for defensible space

- Home Hardening
 - Identify what improvements can be done without permits
 - Simplify permit process for home hardening improvements requiring permits
- Vegetation Management/Defensible Space
 - Align policies with Fire Code
 - Update tree preservation policies
 - Update habitat/vegetation protection requirements
- Develop Public information with guidance and recommendations
