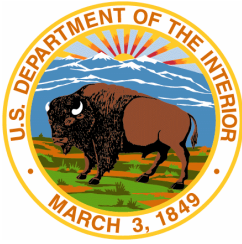

LETTER OF INTENT
FOR
INSTALLATION OF OFFICIAL NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL SIGNS FOR THE JUAN
BAUTISTA DE ANZA NATIONAL HISTORIC TRAIL

The County of Monterey has authorized the Juan Bautista de Anza National Historic Trail (the Trail) to facilitate the installation of official national historic trail Auto Tour signs on roads along the Trail within its jurisdiction.

The National Park Service (NPS) will print and ship 14 new replacement signs to the County of Monterey at the following shipping address: [REDACTED].

The County of Monterey agrees to erect the signs in the locations identified on the attached Sign Management Plan [Enclosure B]. These are current and former locations of the Trail Auto Tour signs. In accordance with the MUTCD 11th Edition Section 2D.58, the signs, designated as M11-1, shall utilize the specifications provided by the Trail sign standards, which follow recommended sizes from Table 2D-2 [Enclosure C]. The Trail shall deliver 14 signs with the top panel measuring 36x36 inches and accompanying panels. The signs shall include the insignia for the national historic trail and directional arrows as needed. The appropriate sign distinction will be made between 'Historic Route' and 'Auto Route', as indicated on Enclosure B and described in Enclosure C. The Trail of NPS retains sole authority for the use of the signs that contain the Juan Bautista de Anza Trail National Historic Trail insignia.

Specifications for signposts and hardware, installation procedures, and distance from the road edge of pavement shall be determined by the County of Monterey staff with sign location assistance provided by the Juan Bautista de Anza National Historic Trail. The signs shall be installed by the County of Monterey in accordance with all federal and state road requirements and agency protocol and specifications. In the case that signs are found to be damaged or in disrepair, the County of Monterey will notify the Juan Bautista de Anza National Historic Trail. The County of Monterey and the Trail will collaborate to replace signs found in disrepair or damaged, as resources and time allow.

In the case of any known transition in the County of Monterey staff participating in this effort, this letter, including the Enclosure, shall be shared with successors; in the case of any known transition in NPS staff, communication with the Trail should include the email address: juba_info@nps.gov for continuity, efficiency, and consistency.
