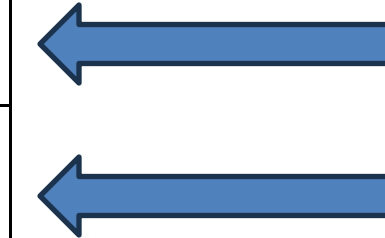
ERF BACKGROUND

- In 2022, the State established the Encampment Resolution Fund (ERF)
- Intended to increase collaboration between the California Interagency Council on Homelessness (CAL-ICH), local jurisdictions, and continuums of care (CoC's) to:
 - Assist Local Jurisdictions in ensuring the safety and wellness in encampments
 - Resolve critical concerns and transition individuals into safe and stable housing
 - Encourage a data-informed, coordinated approach to address encampment concerns
- The County has previously received ERF awards and has implementation experience
- ERF-3 grants will be awarded on a first come first serve basis
- **\$298,747,574** is made available through this NOFA

KING CITY

Goals:

- 1) To attempt to save the Homekey site, ideally working with a new developer
- 2) Avoid the displacement of people currently staying in motels
- 3) Avoid the re-establishment of the Salinas River encampment
- 4) Resolve King City's unsheltered issue
- 5) Provide safe, affordable, permanent housing to former encampment occupants
- 6) Formalize partnership with the City

The Application will contain funding for:

- Motel Vouchers
- Acquisition & Construction
- Operating Subsidies
- Case Management



SOLEDAD

Goals:

- 1) Permanently resolve the encampment on the Salinas River
- 2) Resolve Soledad's and Unincorporated County unsheltered issue
- 3) Provide a pathway to safe, permanent housing to encampment occupants, including families and unaccompanied adults
- 4) Formalize partnership with City of Soledad

The Application will contain funding for:

- Motel Vouchers
- Acquisition & Construction to build a tiny village on Los Coches
- Operating Subsidies
- Diversion
- Rapid Re-Housing
- Case Management
