FY24 Community Project Funding Requests Requested local project funding in the FY24 appropriations process		Three project requests advanced to the full House for consideration; one additional project request advanced to the full Senate for consideration
Winter Storms – Federal Response	Since the levee breach on the Pajaro River on March 10, 2023, Pajaro has suffered devastating damages. The subsequent winter storms have compounded the impact on the area, and county officials and representatives have been working around the clock to secure assistance for county residents and businesses. From a federal perspective, Senator Padilla, Senator Feinstein, Congressman Panetta, and Congresswoman Lofgren have all been highly engaged with me, and have rendered assistance in securing a Presidential Major Disaster Declaration for nine California counties, including Monterey County. Gov. Gavin Newsom sent the request on March 28, 2023. President Biden signed the declaration on April 3, 2023, and it paved the way for the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to provide federal aid to local governments and individuals impacted by storms in February and March.	Active and continued communication and engagement with the federal delegation to ensure that Monterey’s interests and needs are shared and considered in any federal decision-making

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FY23 Community Project Funding Update: Castroville Seawater Intrusion Project (CSIP) and South County Family Justice Center (FJC)	The Monterey County Water Resources Agency received a \$900,000 earmark for the Castroville Seawater Intrusion Project (CSIP) in the FY23 spending bill for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Monterey County Water Resources Agency is engaged with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to move forward with the application process and other requirements to access the grant funding. The County also received a \$250,000 earmark in the FY23 Agriculture/Rural Development spending bill for the establishment of a Family Justice Center in King City. The Monterey County District Attorney's Office submitted the application in late April and has been responding to follow-up inquiries since that time. Additionally, the DA's office is working closely with the County's USDA representative throughout this process.	Regular communication with the federal delegation and county personnel to ensure that the described challenges were corrected/addressed and that the process continues to move forward smoothly
FEMA Denial of Non-Congregate Shelter	Following the Pajaro Levee breach in March, over 500 residents were sheltering at the Santa Cruz Fairgrounds shelter in Watsonville, along with other temporary housing options. Monterey County conducted assessments to review alternatives and determined that initiating NCS was in the best interest of the survivors and taxpayers. Prior to the initiation of non-congregate sheltering, the County had exhausted all local resources to continue congregate sheltering. FEMA provides Public Assistance funding to local government applicants for costs related to emergency sheltering of survivors. The County has received conflicting guidance regarding eligibility to reimbursement of expenses related to NCS pursuant to Public Assistance funding.	Close coordination with Ms. Lofgren's office regarding conflicting guidance the County has received in relation to the FEMA non-congregate shelter (NCS) for displaced Pajaro residents. Ms. Lofgren's office will continue to work with the county and advocate on our behalf with FEMA.
