- 1) Fees listed do not include those fees established by State and Federal codes which are also collected.
- 2) Vehicle Release Fees will be waived for the following circumstances:
  - a. For any registered owner who claims and proves to be indigent.
  - b. When the registered owner is the innocent victim of a crime related to the impoundment of the vehicle.
  - c. When registered owner does not voluntarily request poststorage hearing.
- 3) Government Code Section 27472 state that such fees shall not apply:
  - a. To any person who claims and proves to be indigent
  - b. When the decedent is 14 years or younger
  - c. If the decedent is the innocent victim of a crime
  - d. For storage during the period the Coroner is performing his or her duties about the body
