Adopt Resolution Commending **Darryl A. Tyler** Upon His Retirement After 33 Years of Dedicated Public Service to the Information Technology Department of the County of Monterey.

WHEREAS, Darryl A. Tyler began his career with the County of Monterey on March 5, 1990 as an Engineering Aid III at the for the Monterey County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, performing hydrologic data collection in Monterey County, specifically in the Salinas Valley, where he soon became the technical lead, performing asset mapping using Global Position Systems (GPS); and

WHEREAS, Darryl A. Tyler was then promoted to the position of Hydrology Technician with the Monterey County Water Resources Agency on October 3, 1992, leading the development and implementation of the agency's Geographic Information System (GIS) and in collaboration with Trimble Navigation Ltd. developed and field tested the hardware and software solutions that became the de facto state of the art in geospatial data collection tools and workflows; and

WHEREAS, Darryl A. Tyler per Board Resolution 98-384 was reclassified from Hydrology Technician to Water Resources Technician on August 28, 1999; and

WHEREAS, Darryl A. Tyler was then promoted to Programmer Analyst with the Information Technology Department (ITD) on September 23, 2000; and

WHEREAS, Darryl A. Tyler per Board Resolution 03-007, was reclassified from Programmer Analyst to GIS Analyst II on April 19, 2003, in collaboration with the County of Monterey Health Department, the Northern Salinas Valley Mosquito Abatement District, and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA), Ames Research Center developed the methodology of assessing the risk a mosquito-borne virus (West Nile) of entering a human population, which later evolved into the NASA-funded study that produced a nationally recognized case study for vector surveillance and mitigation; and

WHEREAS, Darryl A. Tyler under the direction of the County of Monterey Department Head GIS Subcommittee organized in 2004 the County's GIS using community into a cooperative body and introduced a collaborative methodology and of working with and maintaining an enterprise geospatial data repository and resources, had geospatial data declared to be public information and publicly available through the County's web mapping sites, then in 2008 served in the County's Emergency Operations Center during Basin Complex Fire proving the efficacy of GIS for decision support in the County's emergency operations; and

WHEREAS, Darryl A. Tyler was then promoted to GIS Analyst III on September 17, 2016, successfully implementing the County's GIS Enterprise infrastructure, and establishing a cooperative enterprise-to-enterprise collaboration with the City of Salinas, as well as setting up secure and ready parcel data sharing process with Monterey County towns, cities and local agencies.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Monterey County Board of Supervisors, on behalf of the County and all residents thereof, hereby express our great appreciation and gratitude to **Darryl A. Tyler** for his dedication during a long and commendable career.
