RE Federal Legislative Update

This memo provides a Federal Legislative Update for items appearing on the agenda for the November 10, 2025, Legislative Committee Meeting.

# a. Federal Government Update

# i. Congressional Overview

As of the time of writing, Congress remains gridlocked. Some commentators believe that the two parties could come to an agreement and re-open the government during the week of November 3, 2025, however that seems optimistic. Democrats and Republicans have begun to speak to one another, but the exact details of an agreement remain unclear. As long as the government remains shutdown, Federal employees will continue to miss paychecks and many programs remain paused. The Pentagon accepted a \$130 million donation to help pay troops during the shutdown, but continuing efforts to source funds remain unclear.

Some up-coming pressure points for lawmakers include a pause on full payments under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) beginning on November 1, 2025; open enrollment for insurance under the Affordable Care Act, which also begins on November 1, 2025; and, subsequent missed paychecks for active-duty military and other federal works.

Given that Congress did not pass supplemental legislation to appropriate funds for SNAP benefits by November 1, 2025, recipients will now look to their states, municipalities, and non-governmental organizations to fill the gap for the duration of the pause.

# ii. Executive Order Updates

President Trump has signed a single executive order since our last report: "Ensuring Continue Accountability in Federal Hiring" on October 15, 2025. This order requires Federal hiring to comply with the Merit Hiring Plan. It also requires each agency to develop a Strategic Hiring Committee to ensure that hiring is consistent with the national interest, agency need, and the Administrations priorities, and to prepare annual staffing plans.

# b. Appropriations Update, including Community Project Funding Requests

With Congress out of session, we still are not seeing any movement on Community Project Funding. At this point in time, we still expect Congress to complete the earmark process for FY 2026, but we will continue to monitor and provide updates on the chart as it progresses.
