O'Neill Sea Odyssey	Transportation for Monterey County Ocean Stewards	Will enable Monterey County classes that want to participate in O'Neill Sea Odyssey's free, ocean-going science and environmental field trip with the financial support to secure bus transportation from their school to OSO's facility at the Santa Cruz harbor. Bus Scholarships are a critical tool to ensure equitable access to our ocean environment.
International Bird Rescue	Resolving Negative Human-Wildlife Interactions in Monterey County 2024	Financial support for a small portion of Monterey County's share of costs for food, medicine, clinic supplies, and medical supplies for native, wild, aquatic birds rescued from Monterey County and transferred to us for care.
The Wahine Project	Access for All	Provide beach and ocean experiences for underserved youth in Castroville. Provide experiences that will increase their knowledge of ecosystem in the Monterey Bay Sanctuary and in turn develop environmental stewardship.
Gage H. Dayton (UCSC)	Nature Detectives: Introduction to local wildlife	To offer younger students in K-1st grade from Marina, CA the chance to explore wildlife and nature and gain basic observational skills in natural history. A series of four days, with two trips per day, include all pre-k through 1st grade classes from all three city of Marina Elementary schools.
SPCA Monterey County	SPCA Monterey County Wildlife Rescue and rehabilitation Center	Every year, the SPCA Monterey County Wildlife Rescue and Rehabilitation Center provides care for an average of 2,500 injured, orphaned, and sick wild animals encompassing over 150 different species. Each injured or orphaned wild animal's rehabilitation schedule is crafted around their unique needs and requires substantial resources. We are the only full-service wildlife rehabilitation center in Monterey County.

Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History	Inviting Youth, Adults, and Families to Explore and Protect Monterey County's Wildlife	The Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History invites youth, adults, and families to participate in the science and conservation of Monterey County's wildlife in fall 2024. Science Saturdays, Community Outreach, Science on Tap, and youth and family programming will bring engaging, hands-on experiences to over 3,000 people throughout Monterey County.
Lazy Arrow Outdoor Adventures	Ray Azbill Junior Pheasant Hunts and Central Coast Women's Pheasant Hunt, 02/03, 04 & 17, 2024	The Ray Azbill Junior Pheasant Hunts and the Central Coast Women's Hunting Clinic are known as some of the premier pheasant hunting programs for the state. The programs provide educational seminars focusing on wildlife and fisheries management, wildlife law enforcement, hunter ethics and safety, shooting skills, game care and offer a hunting opportunity to participants to take pheasants during a live hunt.
Monterey Audubon Society	Fort Ord Natural Reserve Motus Wildlife Tracking System Installation	In Partnership with Fort Ord Natural Reserve we will purchase and install the antennae and associated receiver to integrate into the Motus Wildlife Tracking system, contributing to the growing network. The tower will be installed in summer 2024 and will begin collecting data. This project can be replicated across the Reserve system to quickly increase the Motus tower network, supporting CDFW's Motus Initiative.
Marine Life Studies	Waterproof Marine Mammal Ocean User's Guide	This guide is comprised of illustrations of all the marine mammals that you can see in California, along with their common names, how to responsibly view them in the wild, and a brief description on how to report entangled whales to the 24-hour hotline.
